

- **9.** Use of chords containing tones not found in the prevailing major or minor scale but included in the chromatic scale
- **10.** Short musical idea associated with a person object or thought characteristic of the operas of Wagner
- **12.** Instrumental music associated with a story poem idea or scene
- **14.** In French night piece, a composition usually slow lyrical and intimate in character often for piano solo
