
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Musical Vocabulary

- **5.** A symbol indicating that the note is to be diminished by one semitone
- **7.** A rhythmic succession of musical tones, a melody for instruments and voices.
- **9.** System of notes or tones based on and named after the key note
- **10.** A piece of music written for two vocalists or instrumentalists.

- **11.** Music written for chorus and orchestra. Most often religious in nature.
- **13.** The intonation, pitch, and modulation of a composition expressing the meaning, feeling, or attitude of the music.

- **1.** A song or hymn celebrating Christmas.
- **2.** One or more vocalists performing without an accompaniment.

- **3.** The principal note of a triad.
- **4.** A melodic or, sometimes a harmonic idea presented in a musical form
- **6.** The unit of musical rhythm.
- **8.** A piece of music played at the end of a recital responding to the audiences enthusiastic reaction to the performance, shown by continuous applause.
- **12.** 3 or 4 notes played simultaneously in harmony.
