
## Naval Terminology



## <u>Across</u>

The ribbon worn around a sailor's cap indicating his/her ship.
A lever used for steering, attached to the top of the rudderpost.

**9.** Referring to the four main points of the compass: north, south, east and west.

**10.** Navigational instrument showing the direction of the vessel in relation to the Earth's geographical poles or magnetic poles.

**13.** A compartment, especially in the Royal Navy, from which the ship was navigated

**14.** A lighted or unlighted fixed aid to navigation attached directly to the earth's surface

**16.** The pedestal or housing for the ship's compass, usually located on the bridge or in the wheelhouse. **Down** 

1. Equipment used for lifting, usually consisting of pulleys and lines.

**3.** A condition in which the body core temperature drops to a dangerous level.

**5.** A non-commissioned officer responsible for the sails, ropes, rigging and boats.

**6.** The toilet or latrine of a vessel.

7. The ceiling. The under-side of the deck above.

**8.** When referring to a vessel it implies that it is not under control and therefore goes where the wind and current take her.

**11.** Sweet hot chocolate made from slab chocolate shavings mixed with water into a hot drink.

**12.** An upright wall within the hull of a ship. Occasionally refers to a watertight, load-bearing wall, but not always.

**15.** Toward the stern, relative to some object
