
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Neonatal Assessment Terminology



Across

- **5.** A bluish discoloration of the hands and feet due to sluggish peripheral circulation
- 9. AKA a "soft spot"
- **12.** A flat area of capillary dilation appearing as small clusters of pink-red spots on nose, nape of neck, lower occipital bone, and eyelids that blanch easily (stork bites)
- **15.** Folds of tissue over scrotum that allow for expansion of the tissue
- **16.** fine downy hair covering the body that is normally seen on shoulders
- **17.** This assessment rules out congenital hip instability. A positive sign is palpable dislocation.

<u>Down</u>

- 1. A "newborn rash" characterized by red, elevated papules appearing around 24-48 hours after birth
- **2.** A procedure to rule out congenital hip dislocation; a positive sign is a "click"
- **3.** White, pinpoint papules on chin and/or nose resulting from unopened sebaceous glands
- **4.** A collection of fluid in the soft tissues of the scalp that may override the suture lines and resolves within 24-48 hours
- **6.** A hematoma that that is limited to the suture lines and visually develops of parietal bones

- 7. Discoloration of skin in irregular areas resembling a lace-like pattern
- **8.** Small, white, round epithelial cysts on hard palate and along gum margins
- **10.** A white cheese-like substance covering the body and noticeable in creases of the skin
- **11.** An area of bluish-black pigmentation over buttocks and lower back often seen in non-Caucasian races
- **13.** Gab between abdominal recti muscles
- **14.** Shaping of the head caused by overriding of cranial bones to facilitate movement through birth canal
