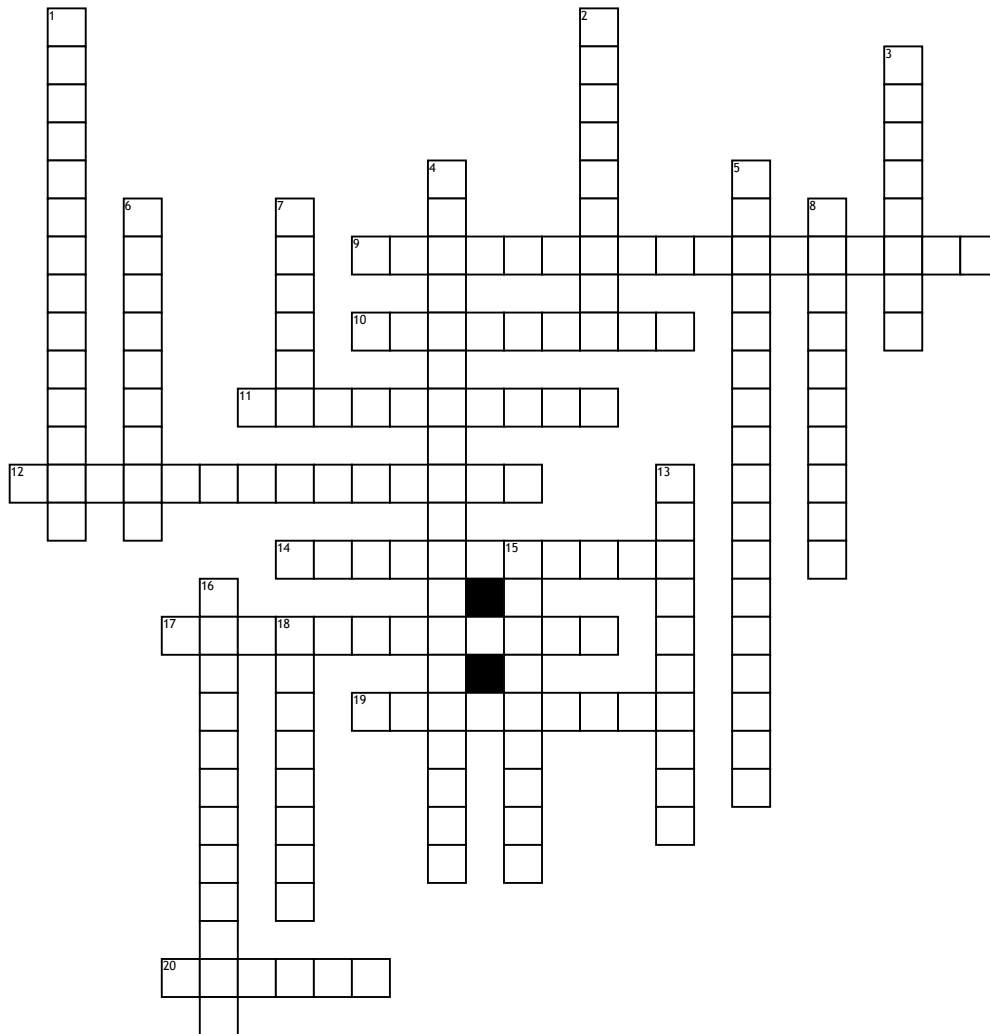


New movements in America, 1815-1850
