

- 3. 1960s, also called the Chicano Civil Rights Movement or El Movimiento, was a civil rights movement extending the Mexican American Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s with the stated goal of achieving Mexican American empowerment.
- **5.** a conservative activist best known for her opposition to the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment during the 1970s.
- **8.** was an American writer, activist, and feminist. A leading figure in the women's movement in the United States, her 1963 book The Feminine Mystique is often credited with sparking the second wave of American feminism in the 20th century.
- **10.** was a Mexican-American physician, surgeon, World War II veteran, civil rights advocate, and founder of the American G.I. Forum.

- 11. was established in December 1970 under United States President Richard Nixon. The EPA is an agency of the United States federal government whose mission is to protect human and environmental health.
- **12.** a United States federal law designed to control air pollution on a national level.
- 13. is an American labor leader and civil rights activist who was the co-founder of the National Farmworkers Association, which later became the United Farm Workers
- 14. was signed on December 28, 1973, and provides for the conservation of species that are endangered or threatened throughout all or a significant portion of their range, and the conservation of the ecosystems on which they depend.
