

1. Provide students with a context for studying traditional academics and learning the skills specific to a career, and provide U.S. schools with a structure for organizing or restructuring curriculum offerings and focusing class make-up by a common theme such as interest
 5. Highly institutionalized, bureaucratic, curriculum driven, and formally recognized with grades, diplomas, or certifications
 6. Is a test developed and maintained by the United States Department of Defense
 14. Fall outside the realm of the normal curriculum of school or university education, performed by students. Such activities are generally voluntary, mandatory, non-paying, social, philanthropic as opposed to scholastic, and often involve others of the same age

 3. The practice of paying close attention to a speaker and asking questions to ensure full comprehension

7. Organized learning outside of the formal education system; tend to be short-term, voluntary, and have few if any prerequisites
 8. A school program that allows students to receive academic credit for career work in the student's field of interest done outside the school
 9. Able to persuade somebody to believe that something is true or to act
 10. Advanced placement, college courses taken in high school
 11. A type of work experience for entry-level job-seekers (Can be paid or unpaid)
 12. One bound by legal agreement to work for another for a specific amount of time in return for instruction in a trade, art, or business
 13. (of handwriting or print) clear enough to read
 15. An official document that gives proof and details of something such as personal status, educational achievements, ownership, or authenticity
