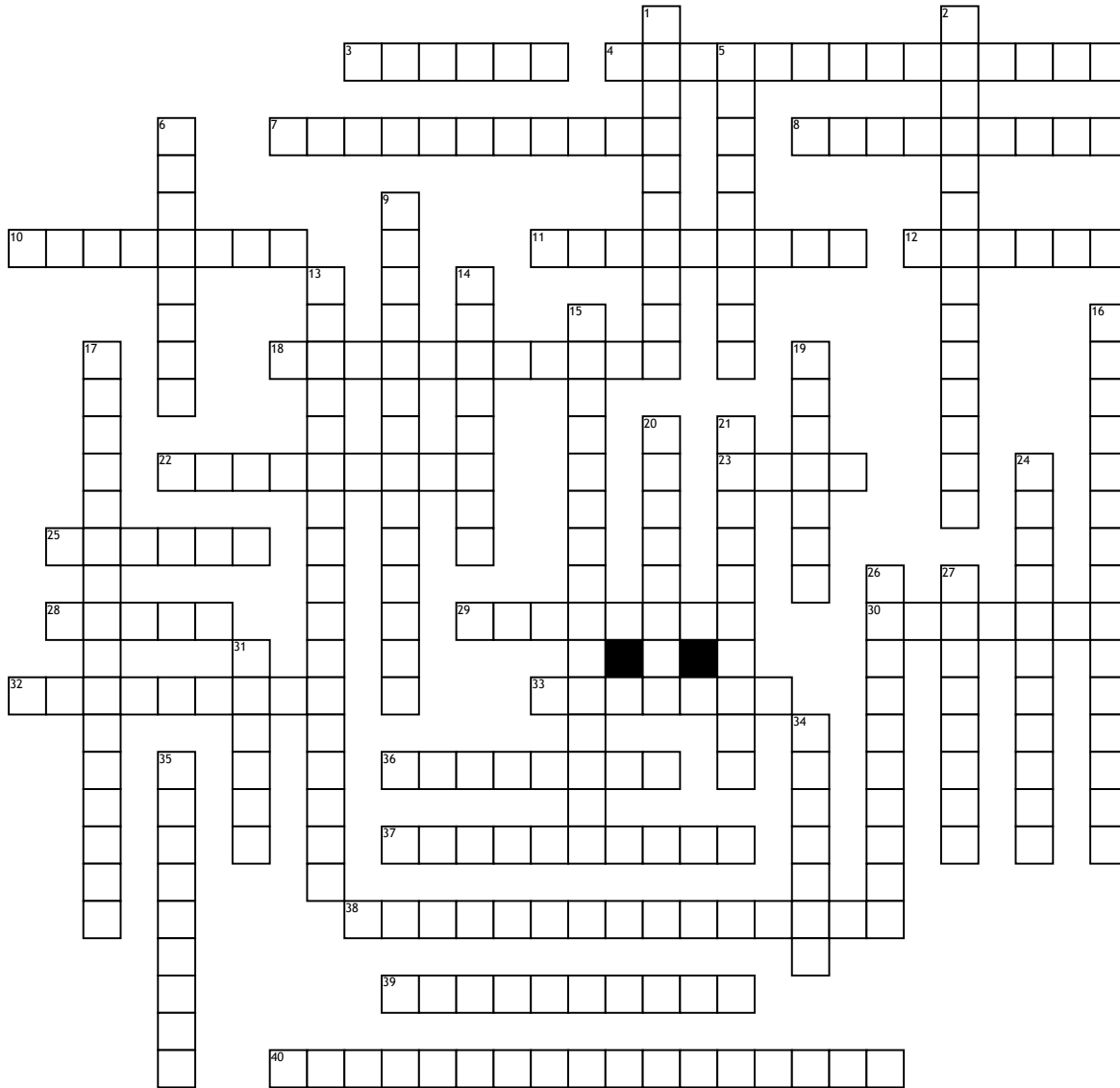

27. when a pregnancy is a normal duration (37-42 weeks gestation)
