
## **Origins of American Government**

9. The document that created the first central government for the U.S.

**10.** The plan for government in which the national government would have supreme power and a legislature with equal representation determined by state population

## <u>Down</u>

**1.** A meeting of colonial delegates in Philadelphia to decide how to respond to the abuses of authority by the British government 2. A group of people who supports the adoption of the U.S. Constitution
3. Law passed by the English Parliament that required a government tax stamp on paper goods and all legal document

4. Formally approved

**5.** A proposal to created a unicameral legislative with equal representation of states instead of representation by population

**6.** Colonies directly controlled by the English king through appointed governors who served as the colonies chief executive

**7.** The first ten amendments to tag U.S. Constitution concerning basic individual liberties
