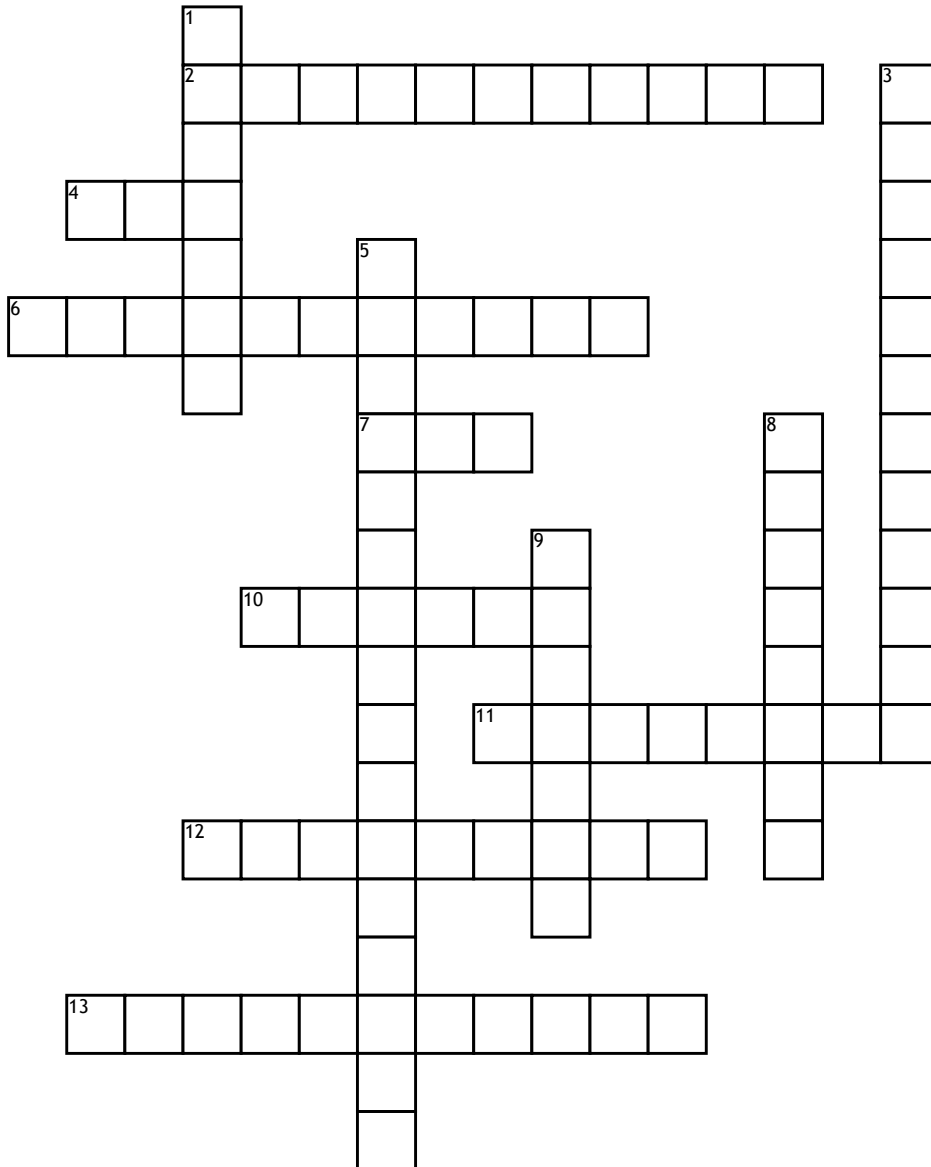

2. An option for consumer to ask questions about health coverage options an obtain assistance with the Marketplace application process.
4. There are separate hospital accounts for hospital and professional charges. In SBO, users have two modes for viewing information and performing actions on accounts. When accounts move to self pay, they appear on a single patient (guarantor) statement.
6. Percentage of cost of a procedure or visit which the patient is expected to pay; i.e.20%.
7. The branch of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that administers Medicare and the federal portion of Medicaid.

10. Also known as the Federal Anti-Dumping Statute; legislation enacted in 1986 in response to concerns that hospitals were refusing to treat patients without insurance and even transferring them to other facilities and leaving them there, sometimes without notifying the receiving facility.
11. A health insurance program for the elderly (age 65 or older) and those under age 65 who have permanent disabilities or end stage renal disease (ESRD).
12. A standard list of checks that run after minimum days have been met for an account. These check to see that certain conditions have been met by the account.
13. A person who has healthcare insurance through Medicare.

1. A collection of charges or transactions for an individual patient or group of people, see also Guarantor Account and Hospital Account.
3. A rule to determine coordination for benefits for a child covered by both parents; it dictates that the parent with the first birthday in the calendar year will provide the primary coverage;
5. The process of obtaining authorization from an insurance company review organization approving the medical necessity of a hospitalization.
8. A health insurance program for certain low-income people; it is funded and administered through a state-federal partnership
9. A module in EPIC used for scheduling appointments
