

- **4.** Scrapes away loose paint, or to apply filler
- 7. Cleans paint brushes
- 9. Helps you reach elevated areas
- 13. Removes mildew and dirt
- **14.** Removes corrosion from metal surfaces
- **16.** Removes loose or peeling paint from wood, plaster, and other surfaces
- **17.** Protects carpets and walls when painting baseboards and other trim
- 18. Loads rollers with paint
- 19. Protects furniture & floors from paint

- **20.** Applies caulk to cracks in walls & gaps, and the junction of different surfaces
- 21. Fills in and smooth patching compounds in plaster and wallboard Down
- 1. Removes efflorescence and loose material from masonry, or to remove loose, flaking paint
- 2. Cleans large exterior surfaces
- **3.** Fill nail holes and small imperfections in walls
- **5.** Holds sandpaper and help you sand surfaces to an even finish

- **6.** Removes paint in small or tight areas
- **8.** Mixes paint and carry it to the worksite
- 10. Clears loose material from masonry
- **11.** Replace cracked, broken, or missing panes of glass
- **12.** Protects window panes and trim from paint
- **15.** Smooths painted surfaces, or to roughen glossy surfaces so paint will adhere better
