

- **25.** (1651) Mercantilist policy which limited foreign trade in the colonies as well as the use of foreign ships.
- **26.** Introduced tobacco as a commercial crop to Virginian colonists.
- **28.** Companies made up of group of investors who bought the right to establish plantations from the king.
- **29.** Individuals who worked for a certain period of time for a person who paid for their voyage to the colonies
- **30.** The first compact that allowed self-government to be created and enforced in America.
