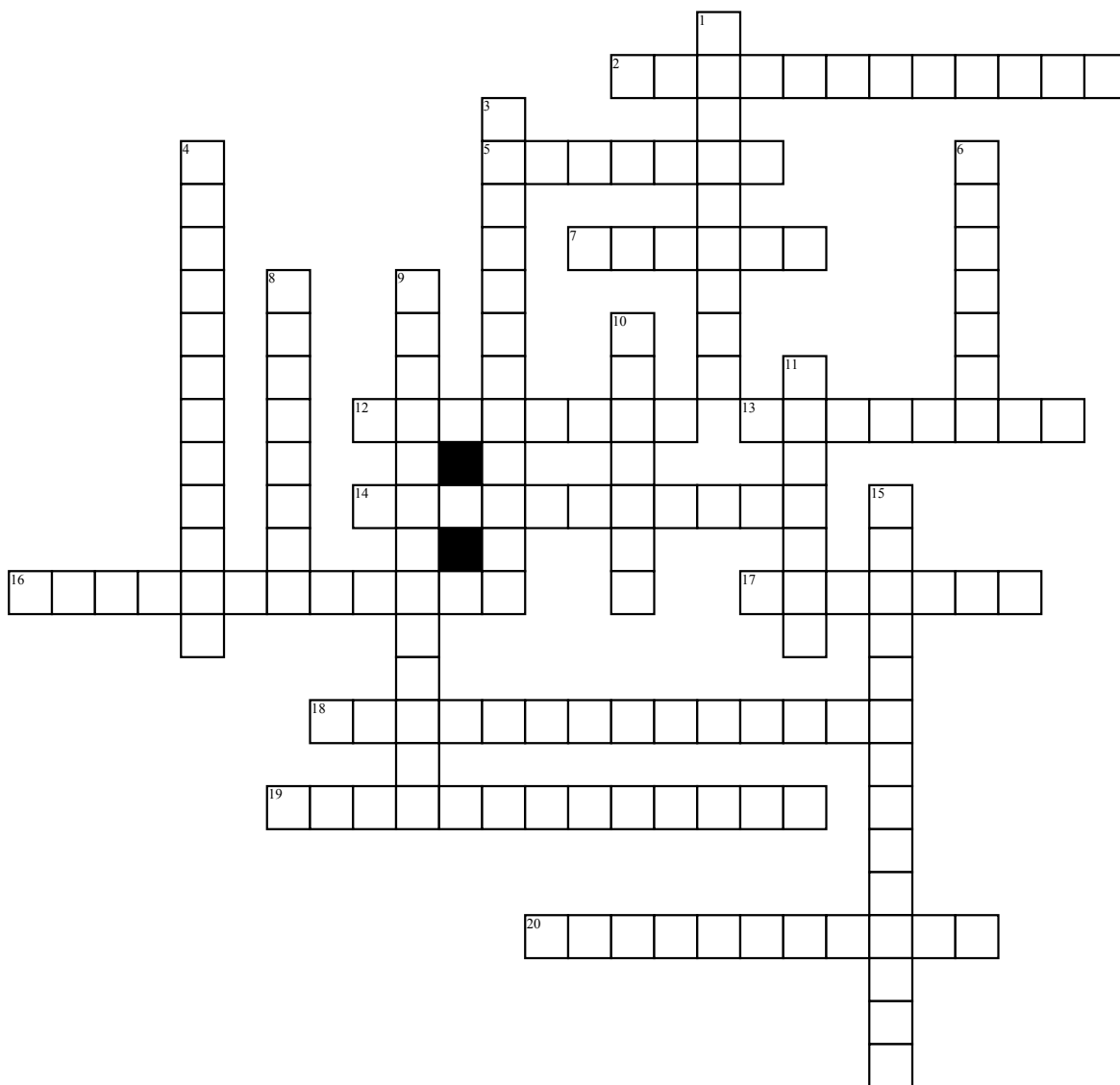

13. A life-threatening infection occurring when dead and dying tissue close off the circulation of blood to limbs.

composed of one or few cells that can be seen only through a microscope.

1. The bottom part of the brain that links to the spinal cord and controls such involuntary functions as breathing, heart rate, and reflex reactions.

3. The middle portion of the cortex at the back of the head.
