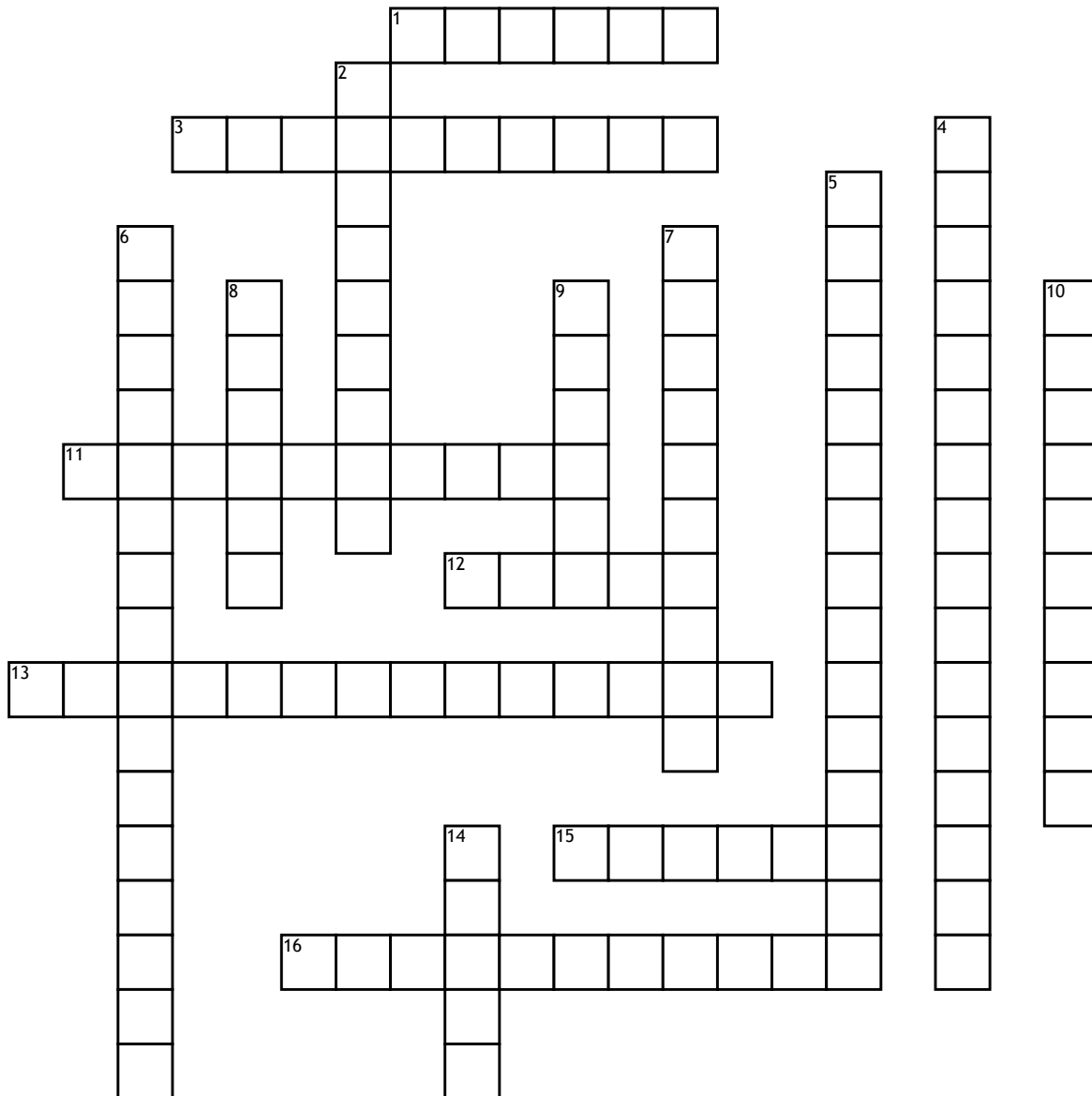

1. A poem that's arranged in quatrains with the same ABAB rhyme scheme.
3. Repeating of a consonant sound. Considered slant rhymes.
11. A poetic foot is a complete segment of a poem containing at least 2 sequences of unstressed and stressed elements.
12. When two words sound similar 2 rhyming lines minimum.
13. Poetry that's emotional and dramatic.
15. A 14 line intro commonly used at the beginning of a drama. This type of poetry contains 10 syllables in each line and is written in iambic pentameter.
16. Formal poetry in which the author's feelings and emotions are expressed typically in the 1st person point of view.

2. Repeating of a vowel sound of diphthong in non-rhyming words. Considered slant rhymes.
4. A line of verse with 5 metrical feet, each consisting of one unstressed syllable followed by one stressed syllable.
5. Poetry in which the poem is narrated and tells a story.
6. The words are similar but not identical.
7. Long and narrative poems often about or inspired by heroic figures.
8. The measured flow of words determined by the relation of long and short syllables.
9. A written form of information intended to contain rhythm or some form of organizational structure.

10. A rhyme with identical stressed vowels same consonants and vowels.

14. Japanese verse written in 17 syllables divided into 3 lines which each line having 5 7 and 5 syllables. Normally contains highly evocative allusions. Typically about nature and its scenery.
