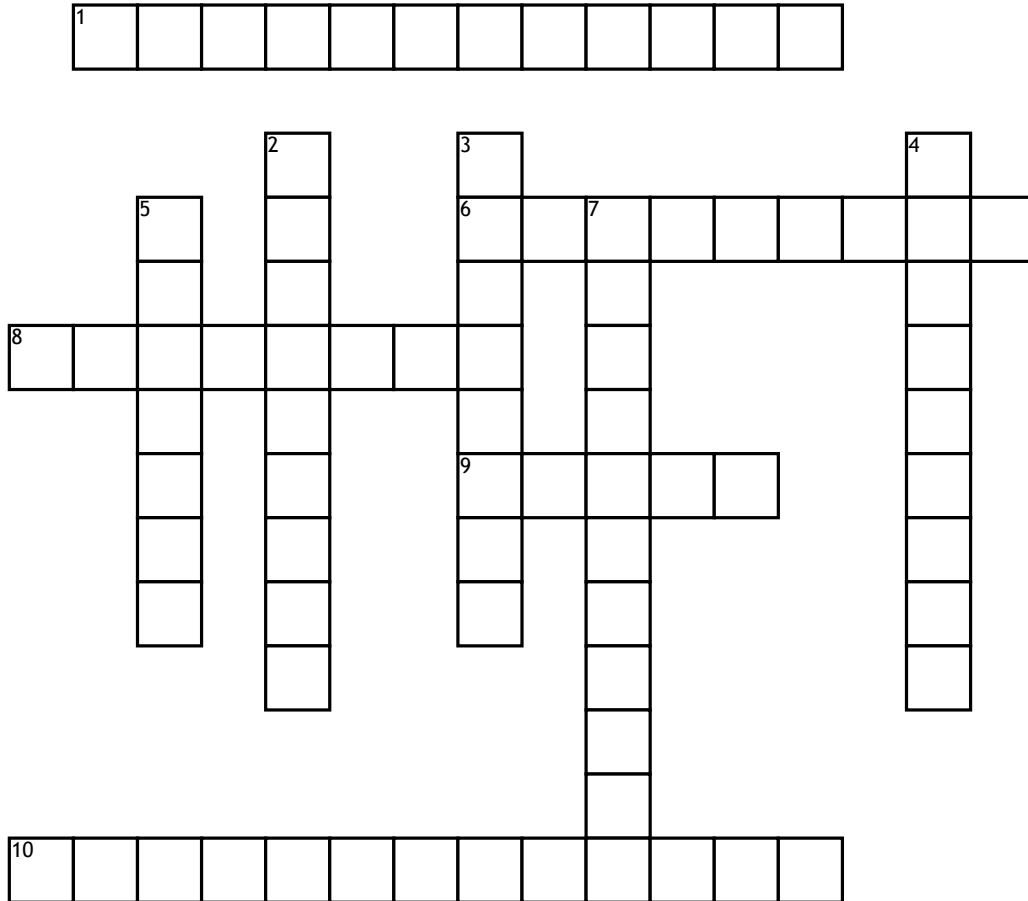


Popular Literary Devices

- 1. A series of words that all start with the same letters or sound.
- 6. An exaggerated statement that emphasizes the significance of the statement's actual meaning.
- 8. The repetition of a word or a phrase at the beginning of a series of clauses or sentences.
- 9. A recurring element that develops the theme of the narrative - a symbol, an image, a concept.
- 10. Hinting at events yet to come, to create suspense or tension.

- 2. An indirect or more polite way of describing something deemed "inappropriate" to address directly.
- 3. When two or more parrallel clauses are inverted.
- 4. When the narrative jumps into the past.
- 5. An appeal to the reader's senses through descriptive language.
- 7. The mode of narration in a story. It has a huge impact on the reading experience.
