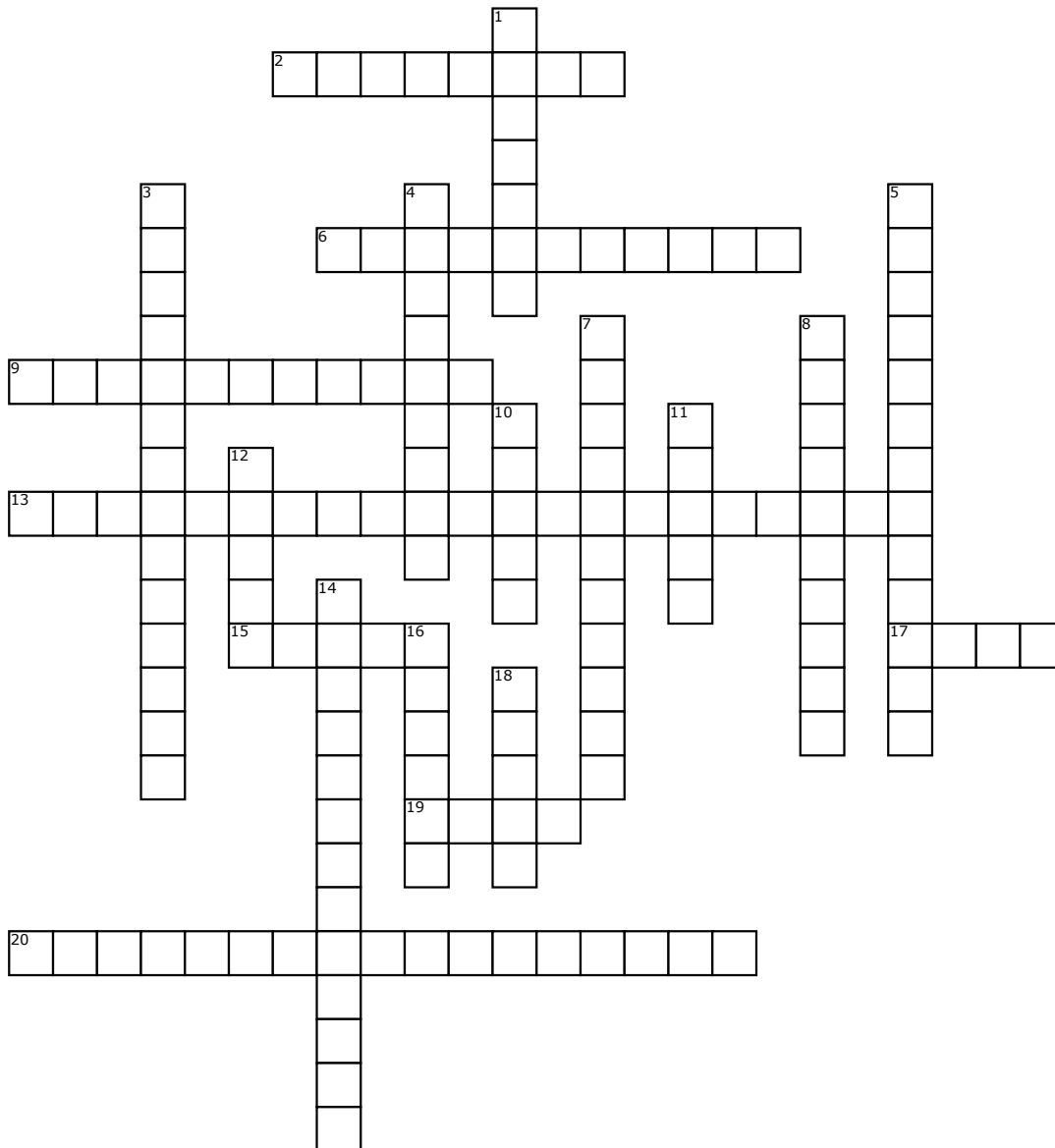

- 2.** A major religious and cultural tradition of South Asia, developed from Vedic Religion
- 6.** a religious way of life in which one renounces worldly pursuits to devote oneself fully to spiritual work. Monastic life plays an important rule in many Christian churches, especially in the Catholic and Orthodox traditions
- 9.** Worldwide community of Christians, adherants of Christianity, or nations in which Christianity is the established religion
- 13.** Also Known As Wat Tyler's rebellion or the Great Rising, was a major uprising across large parts of England in 1381
- 15.** the Muslim inhabitants of Maghreb, North Africa, the Iberian Peninsula, Sicily, and Maita during the Middle Ages, who initially were Berber and Arab peoples from North Africa

- 3.** A Muslim kingdom based mostly in Delhi that stretched over large parts of the Indian subcontinent for 320 years
- 4.** A temple complex in Cambodia and the largest religious monument in the world
- 5.** A branch of Eastern Orthodoxy which formally broke with the Western (or Roman Catholic) chruhc in AD 1054, separate from Catholicism, many practices are similar
