

- **2.** Persistent non-blanchable deep red, maroon or purple discoloration
- **4.** Partial Loss of dermis indicated by a shallow open ulcer
- **6.** Traumatic injuries caused by small mounts of pressure over a long period of time or by sliding over a surface.
- 8. Full thickness skin loss
- **9.** Obscured full thickness skin and tissue loss. (unable to visualize the base of the wound.)
- 11. Full thickness skin and tissue loss

<u>Down</u>

- **1.** Traumatic skin injury caused by opening of the skin from various external sources
- **3.** Wounds that cause aching pain in the lower leg, irregular boarders, very shallow and often will weep fluid.
- **5.** Wounds that are located on the lower legs or feet, pale in color, well defined boarders.
- 7. Often found in the peri area and buttocks.
- 10. Non-Blanchable reddness of intact skin
