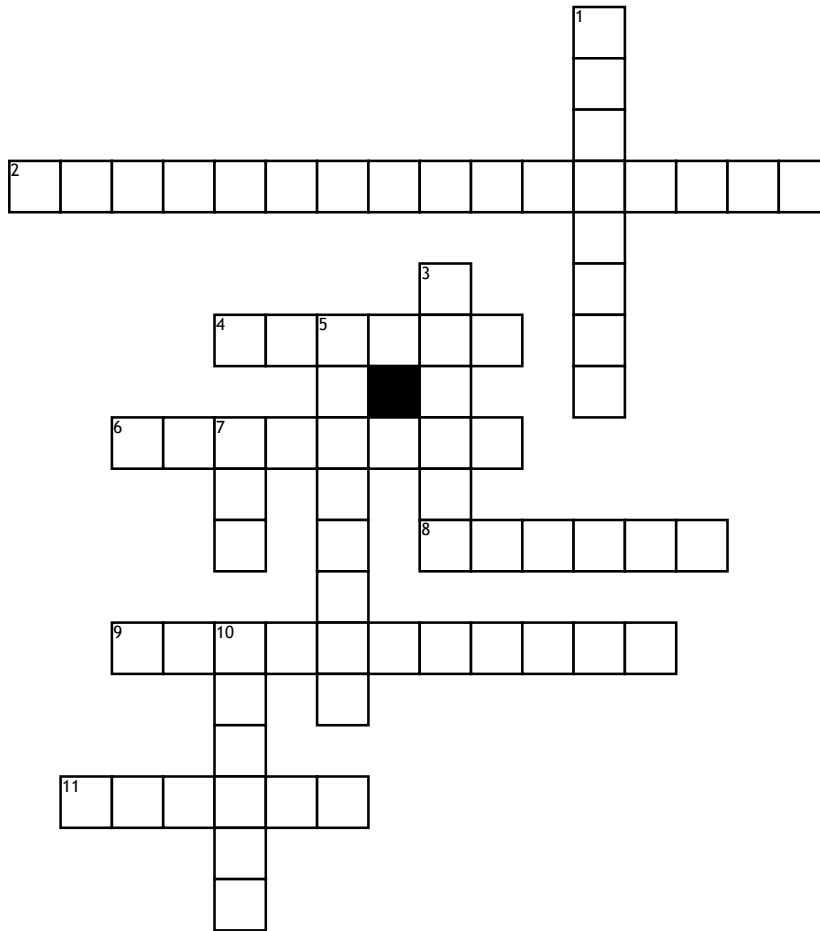

2. Persistent non-blanchable deep red, maroon or purple discoloration
4. Partial Loss of dermis indicated by a shallow open ulcer
6. Traumatic injuries caused by small mounts of pressure over a long period of time or by sliding over a surface.
8. Full thickness skin loss
9. Obscured full thickness skin and tissue loss. (unable to visualize the base of the wound.)
11. Full thickness skin and tissue loss

Down

1. Traumatic skin injury caused by opening of the skin from various external sources
3. Wounds that cause aching pain in the lower leg, irregular borders, very shallow and often will weep fluid.
5. Wounds that are located on the lower legs or feet, pale in color, well defined borders.
7. Often found in the peri area and buttocks.
10. Non-Blanchable redness of intact skin
