

- **2.** The most common form of Hepatitis virus, there is a vaccine available.
- **4.** Sexually transmitted disease caused by the bacterium Neisseria gonorrhoeae.
- **7.** The common flu. Spread by respiratory droplets.
- 10. This virus normally grows in the cells that line the back of the throat. Characterized by rash, high fever, cough, runny nose, and red, watery eyes.
- 11. This is the sexually transmitted disease type of the herpes virus.
- 13. This disease lasts for many weeks and is typically found in children and causes spasms of severe coughing, whooping, and cough induced vomiting.

- **15.** This form of Hepatitis can cause life long infection, cirrhosis of the liver, liver failure, and death. There is a vaccine available.
- **16.** This disease causes rash that becomes vesicular within days and then scabs form. Most commonly found in children.
- 17. Sexually transmitted disease caused by the bacterium Treponema pallidum.

- 1. This form of Hepatitis is usually a co-infection with Hepatitis B. It has the same vaccine as Hepatitis B.
- **3.** Fungal infection in the mouth, on the skin, or vaginal area. More commonly known as a yeast infection.
- **5.** This is the Herepes virus that causes cold sores.

- **6.** A disease caused by bacteria called Mycobacterium tuberculosis.
- **8.** This form of Hepatitis is transmitted like Hepatitis A and can be found where sewage disposal is inadequate. There is no vaccine.
- **9.** An infection of the salivary glands caused by a fever. symptoms include fever, headache, muscle ache, and swelling of the glands close to the jaw.
- **12.** Type of virus that destroys motor neurons.
- **14.** This form of Hepatitis is spread by contact with the blood of an infected person. There is no vaccine.
