
Principles of Hair Design

- **15.** The "focus", or area in hairstyle where the eye is drawn first
- **16.** Curved lines used to soften or blend horizontal or vertical lines
- **17.** Two mirrored halves of a style

- 2. Repeating lines in a hairstyle
- 4. Natural wave patterns
- **6.** A recurrent movement in a design

- 7. A hairstyle with only one line, such as a one length cut
- **9.** Outline of the face from a side view
- **10.** The area surrounding the form/area a hairstyle occupies
- 12. Lines parallel to the floor
- **14.** Mass or general outline of a hairstyle
