

- **14.** Declared that all persons born or naturalized in the United States were entitled equal rights regardless of their race
- **15.** The right to vote
- **16.** National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, founded in 1909 to work for racial equality
- 17. A tax of a fixed amount per person and payable as a requirement for the right to vote

- **18.** President who reformed government through the Square Deal **20.** 1906 Laid down binding rules for sanitary meat packing and government inspection of meat products crossing state lines.
- **21.** Gave Congress the power to pass an income tax
