

- 1. Particular way of studying something in order to discover new information about it or better
- 2. Watching & recording the behavior of an organism in their natural environment

- 3. Participants & researcher doesn't know who obtained treatment
- 4. Study of behavior in controlled situation
- 5. Studies the effects or changes over a long period of time
- 6. A way to gather information about a topic or situation where an experiment is not possible
- 7. Study of one individual in great depth
- 10. Collecting information, usually from groups of people
