

- **2.** One of Thorndike's laws of learning states the consequence of a response will determine whether the tendency to respond In that way will be higher or lower
- **3.** Operant conditioning technique that consists of gradually molding a desired behavior
- **6.** Event that follows a response and increases the probability that the response will be repeated
- **10.** Soundproof chamber with a device for delivering food to an animal subject
- 11. Reinforcer that fulfills a basic physical need for survival and does not depend on learning

- **12.** Intense dislike and/or avoidance of a food associated with nausea or discomfort
- **13.** Anything that follows a response and weakens it
- **14.** Any event or object in the environment to which an organism responds
- **15.** Voluntary behavior accidentally brings a consequence

1. Relatively permanent change in behavior, knowledge, capability, or attitude that is acquired through experience and can't be attributed to illness, injury, or maturation

- **4.** Schedule in which a reinforcer is given after a fixed number of correct, nonreinforced responses
- **5.** Anything that follows a response and strengthens it
- **7.** Weakening and eventual disappearance of the conditioned response
- **8.** Learned ability to distinguish between similar stimuli
- **9.** Tendency to make a conditioned response to a stimulus that is similar to the original conditioned stimulus
