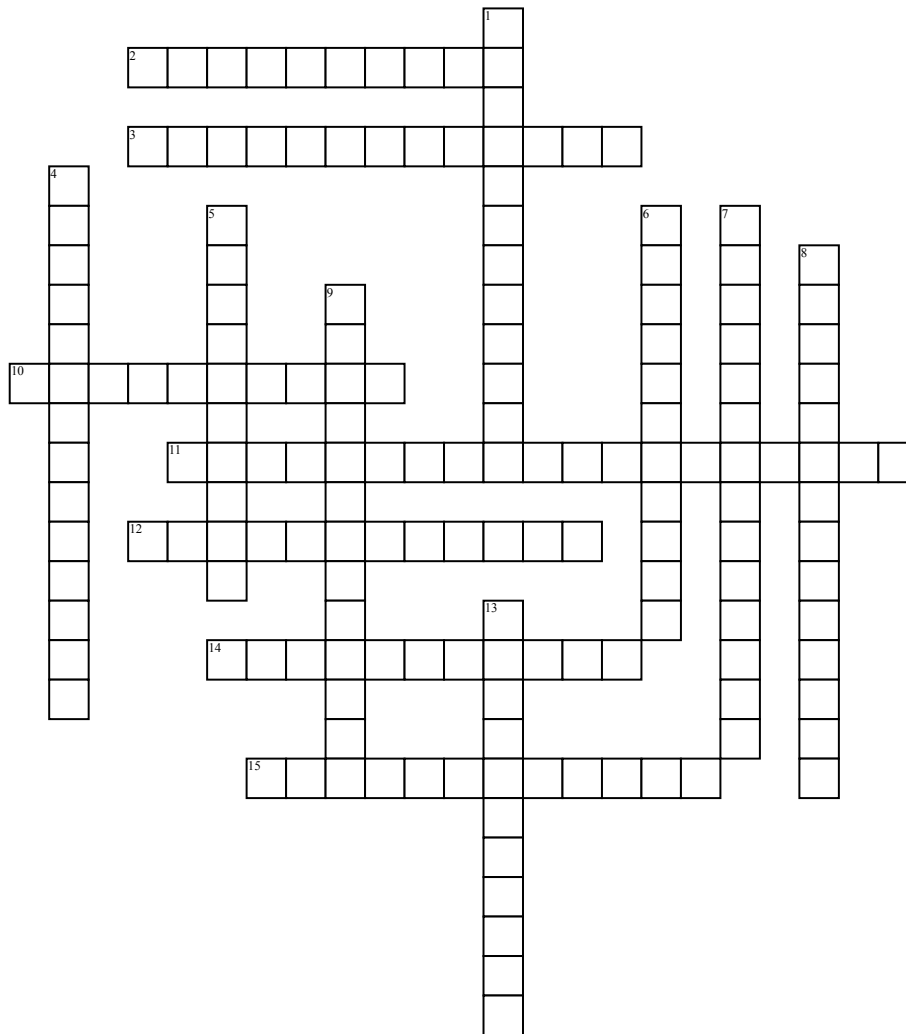

2. this may take place when a researcher is gaining little or no new information
 3. the use of two or more strategies to collect, interpret, or analyze information
 10. type of interviews where interviewers are trained to ask a question as it is precisely written
 11. the phase used to describe the period of time spent in the field observing the phenomenon of interest
 12. refers to a broad arena of philosophy concerned with the nature and scope of practice

14. type of research understood as the systematic study of social phenomena

15. a person who are specifically selected for interview on the basis of their expertise in areas relevant to the research

1. type of interviews that resemble guided conversations
 4. type of interviews that provide some structure by using a combination of fixed responses and open ended questions
 5. includes personal notes and reflections, copies of all instruments used, and explanations of procedures

6. requires careful watching, listening, and recording of events, behaviors, and objects

7. an inductive method designed to construct theory from qualitative data

8. a way for opposing opinions to be heard and contrary explanations for the phenomenon to be aired

9. a way of doing research and a way of questioning and conceptualizing thought
