


Reproduction and Development CW PUZZLE

- 3.** Innermost lining of the uterus where the embryo implants and develop
- 8.** Paired tubes that are connected to the uterus and terminate near the ovaries
- 9.** Paired glands that produce clear, viscous secretion known as pre-ejaculate that helps to lubricate the urethra for sperm to pass through, neutralizing traces of acidic urine in the urethra, and helps flush out any residual urine or foreign matter
- 11.** Stage of development involving a series of mitotic divisions to produce a multicellular blastula from a unicellular zygote

12. Carrying of embryo inside the female reproductive tract, specifically the uterus

13. Where the sperm passes through from the testis before it joins the urethra

15. A type of contraception where the man and the woman do not engage in sexual intercourse

1. Stage of development characterized by an increase in size of an individual

2. Involves formation of sex cells, zygote formation, subsequent stages in one's life span. Terminated by death.

4. Part of the menstrual cycle of the uterus; corresponds to the latter part of the follicular phase of the ovaries, when the endometrium heals and begins to thicken as a consequence of estrogen secretion

5. Process where the blastocyst implants itself in the endometrium; this signals the start of pregnancy

6. A human blastula made up of a solid ball of cells

7. Part of the menstrual cycle of the uterus; also known as the "period"

10. Part of the menstrual cycle of the ovary after the oocytes are released from the follicles

14. Where sperm is temporarily stored
