
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Reproductive Management

- 1. birthing difficulty
- 3. female sex steroid hormone produced by the corpus luteum or placenta
- 6. the gamete from the female; capable of uniting with the male gamete 9. first milk given by the female after birth of the young
- 13. one of two small exocrine glands in the male reproductive system that function to lubricate the spongy urethra for the passage of the ejaculate
- 14. acts as a functional barrier between the internal and external environments in the female; dilates during parturition to allow the fetus to pass through the uterus into the vagina

- **15.** area of the brain that is responsible for many homeostatic functions; produces GnRH
- **16.** where the ovum is first captured following release from the follicle **Down**
- 2. a follicle that is ready to ovulate after maturation; the follicular stage after the first meiotic division but before ovulation
- **4.** the process of transferring fertilized embryos from one female to another female
- **5.** also known as CL; ovarian structure responsible for the production of progesterone for the support of pregnancy
- 7. ligament in the female that attaches the uterus to the pelvis

- **8.** a long, coiled tube in males that rests on the backside of each testicle; carries and stores the sperm cells produced by the testes
- 10. sex organs that produce gametes; testis in the male and the ovary in the female
- **11.** a hollow, muscular organ in the female where the developing fetus resides
- 12. abbreviation for Gonadotropin-releasing hormone; a hormone produced by the hypothalamus that is responsible for the release of follicle-stimulating hormone (FSH) and luteinizing hormone (LH)
