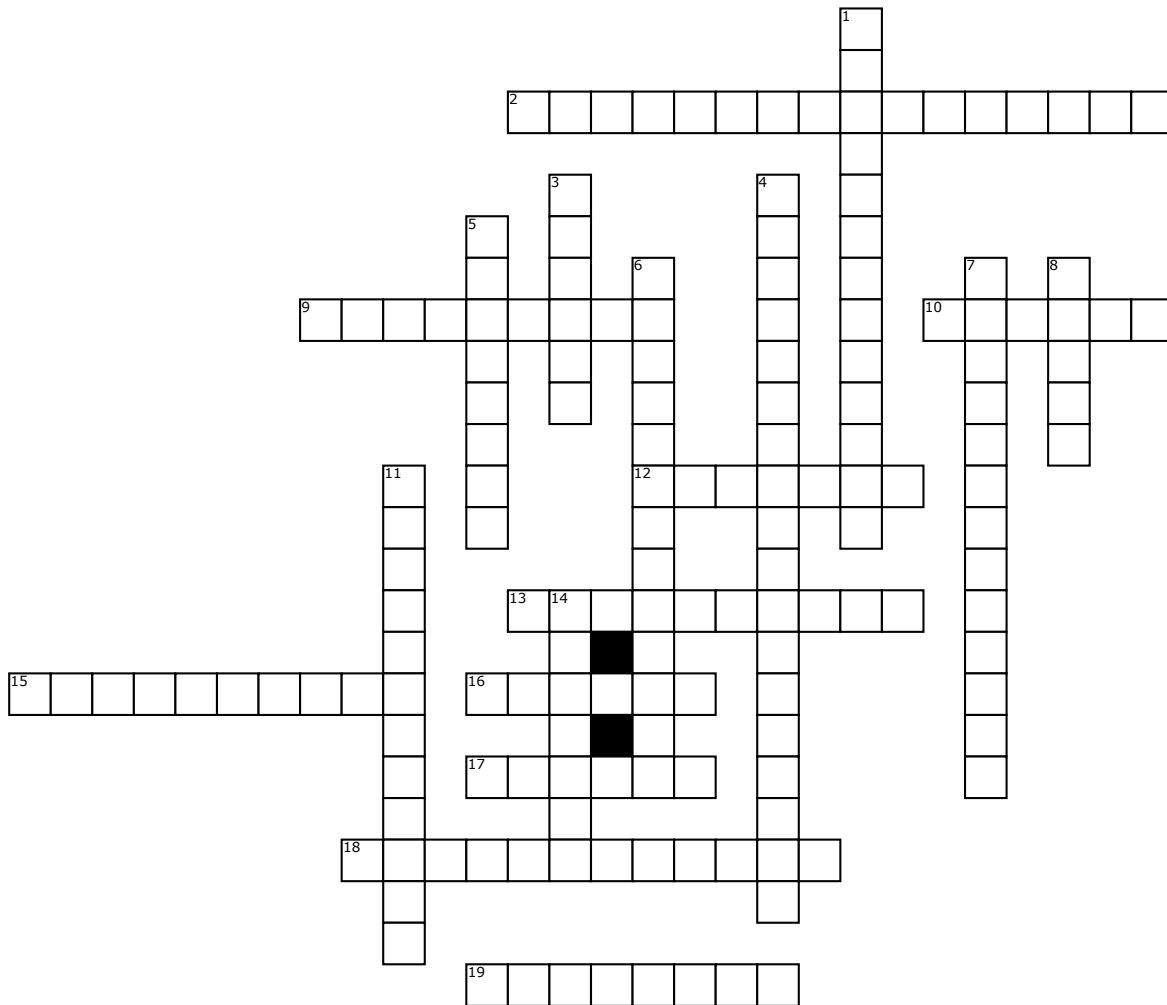


# Reproductive System

**6.** one of two fluid-filled tubes in human females through which an egg passes after its release from an ovary

**7.** process in sexual reproduction in which male and female reproductive cells join to form a new cell

**8.** (vertebrates) one of usually two organs that produce ova and secrete estrogen and progesterone

**11.** endocrine tissue which produces hormones, estrogen, and progesterone which prepares the uterine lining for receiving an embryo
