

- 2. He wrote the "Common Sense" pamphlet in January in 1776
- 4. This happened because of the tension between the colonists and the redcoats. John Adams used this event as propaganda, that made the colonists think about becoming independent from England
- **10.** This act required colonists to house British troops and provide them with food and other supplies
- 11. He was sent to warn the colonists and minutemen. His ride throughout the night was remembered as his "Midnight Ride"
- Tax against tea. It happened in 1773
 A letter sent to King George III in 1775, which stated that the colonists desire peace and asked the king to protect them

- 1. He was sent in 1753 to warn French that they were trespassing, also the was the first president of the United States
- 3. British general that decided to take away the arms and ammunition from the colonists
- **5.** This was the protest against the Tea act. The Sons of Liberty dressed up as Native Americans and threw 342 cases of tea into the Boston Harbor
- **6.** This act made the colonists buy special tax stamps for all kinds of products such as newspapers, wills, land titles, etc. This started the slogan "No taxation without representation"

- 7. These acts are the reaction by the king from The Boston Tea Party. These acts included 4 new and upgraded acts that were given to the colonists by King George III
- **8.** This act placed a tax on several products including molasses. It started in 1764
- **9.** He presented to the House of Burgess that the Stamp Act violated the colonists rights, and got it repealed in October in 1776
- **12.** Him and James Otis helped spread the slogan "No taxation without representation". He helped start the Committees of Correspondence, spreaded the word to boycott
