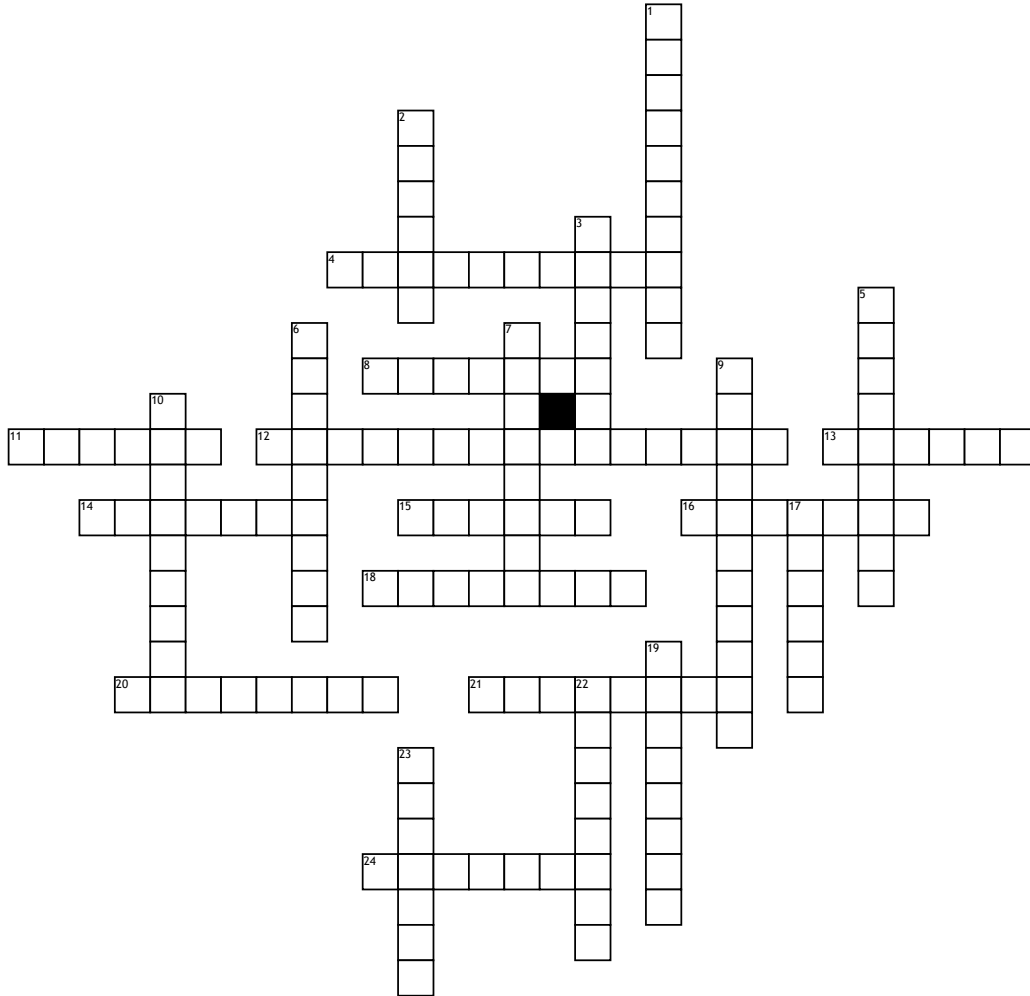

- 13. To sign or give formal consent to (a treaty, contract, or agreement), making it officially valid.
- 14. A state's annual income from where public expenses are met.
- 15. A tax or duty to be paid on a particular class of imports or exports.
- 16. Enlist (someone) in the armed forces.

- 18. A formal written request, typically one signed by many people, appealing to authority with respect to a particular cause.

- 21. An act or means of sealing off a place to prevent goods or people from entering or leaving.
- 24. A collection of weapons and military equipment stored by a country, person, or group.
