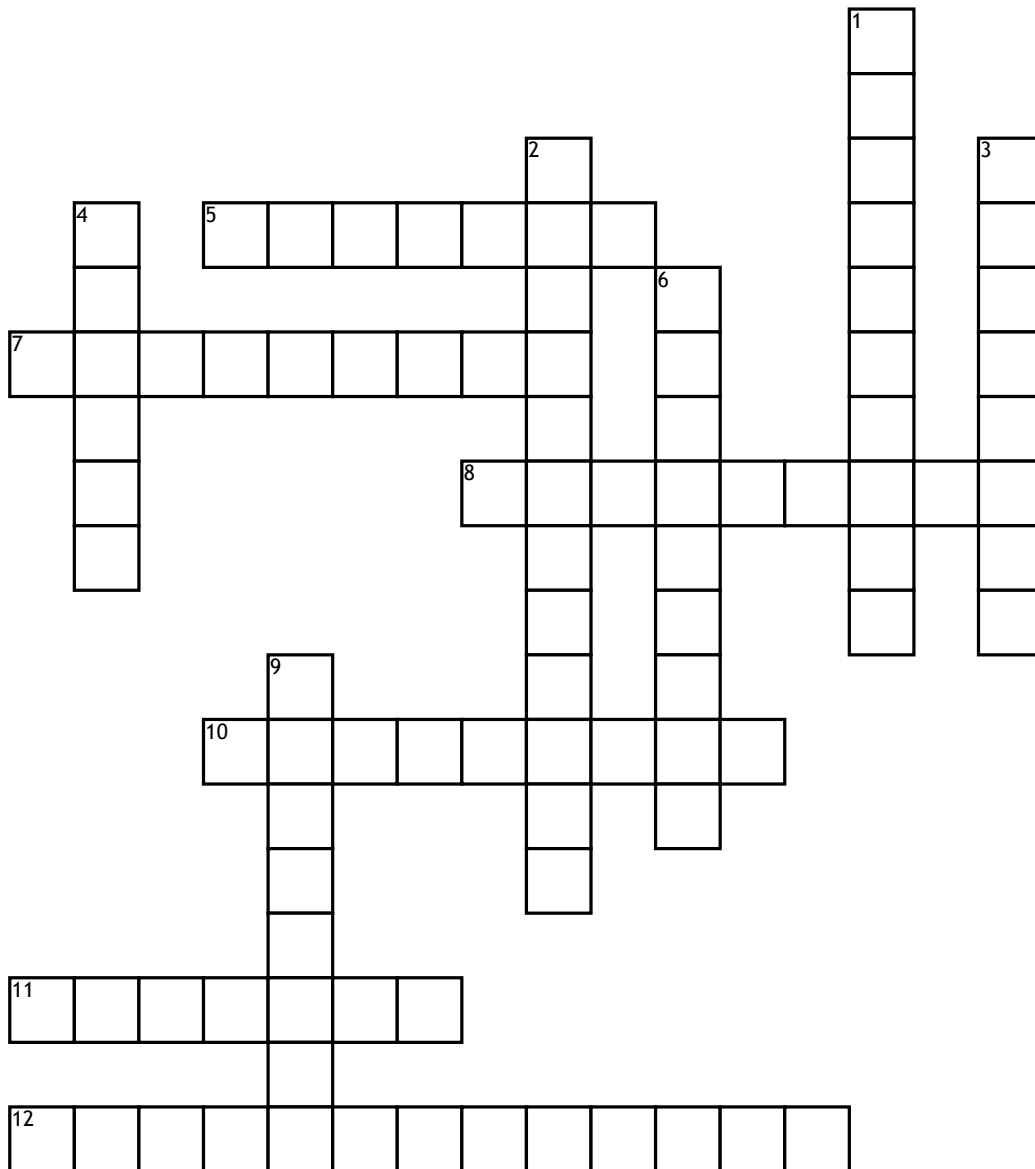


# Rhetorical Devices Practice

11. the repetition of a word or phrase after an intervening word or phrase ("we will do it, i tell you; we will do it")

12. when two words or phrases are placed close to each other for a contrasting effect

1. the use of slang or informal speech in writing

2. additional conjunctions are added for emphasis

3. a figure of speech in which two clauses with parallel structure are repeated, but the order in which it is presented is reversed (criss-cross)

4. a literary term meaning sermon

6. a single word or phrase which is inserted to draw attention to the ideas on either side of it

9. one of the devices of repetition, this one is where a word or series of words is repeated at the beginning of successive lines
