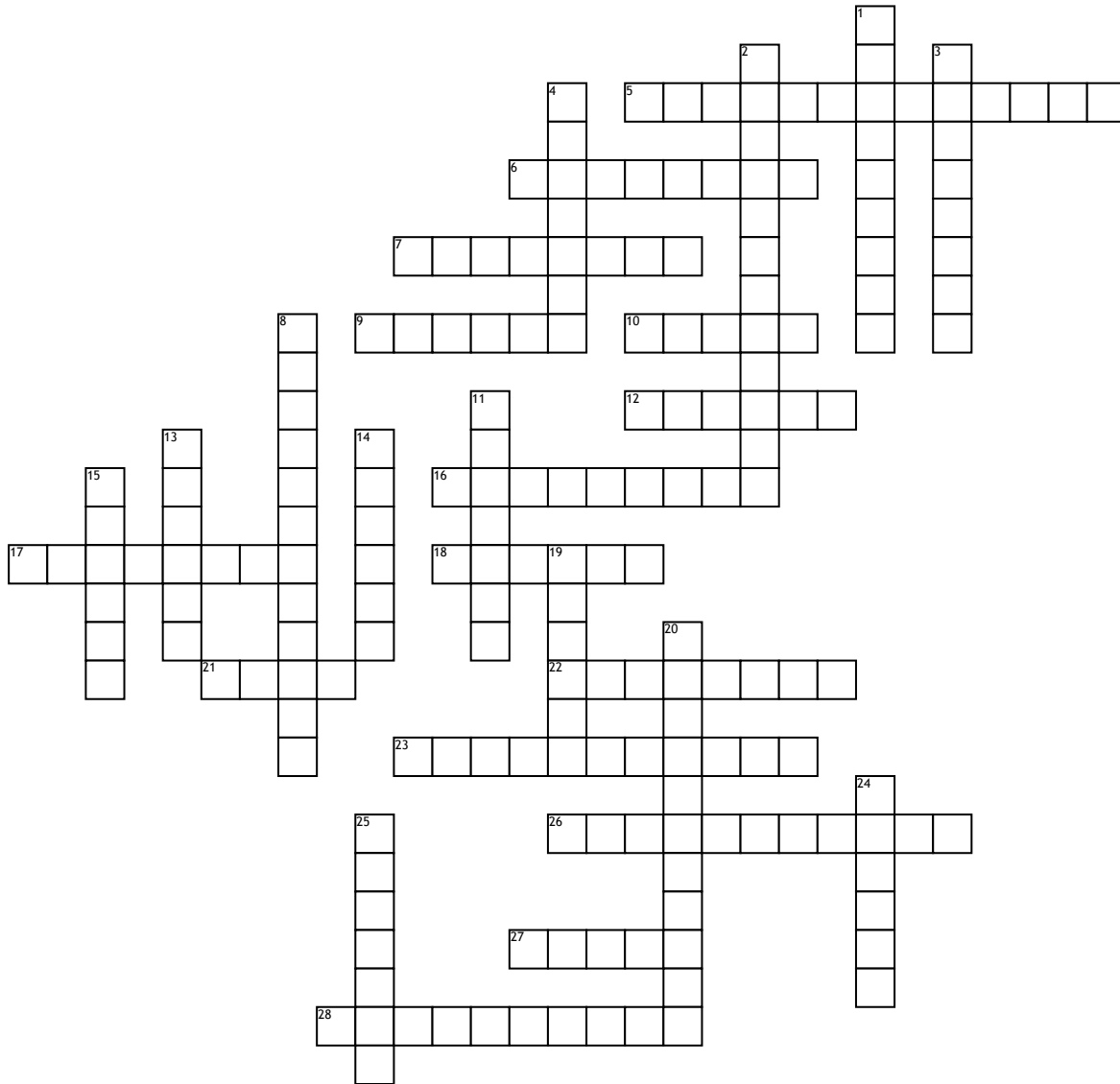


Rome/Islam Vocabulary

 10. the holy book of Islam
 12. a central space/courtyard within a building that is open to the sky
 16. in ancient Rome, a wealthy citizen who claimed to be able to trace his/her roots back to the founding of Rome
 17. a follower who helps spread the ideas and teachings of another; in the Christian faith; follower of Jesus

18. in ancient Rome, one of its two government officials; a person appointed by a government to represent its interests in a foreign city

 22. tunnels and bridges built to transport water; first built in ancient Rome

 26. a method of execution in which the victim is nailed/tied on a wooden cross; often used in ancient Rome
