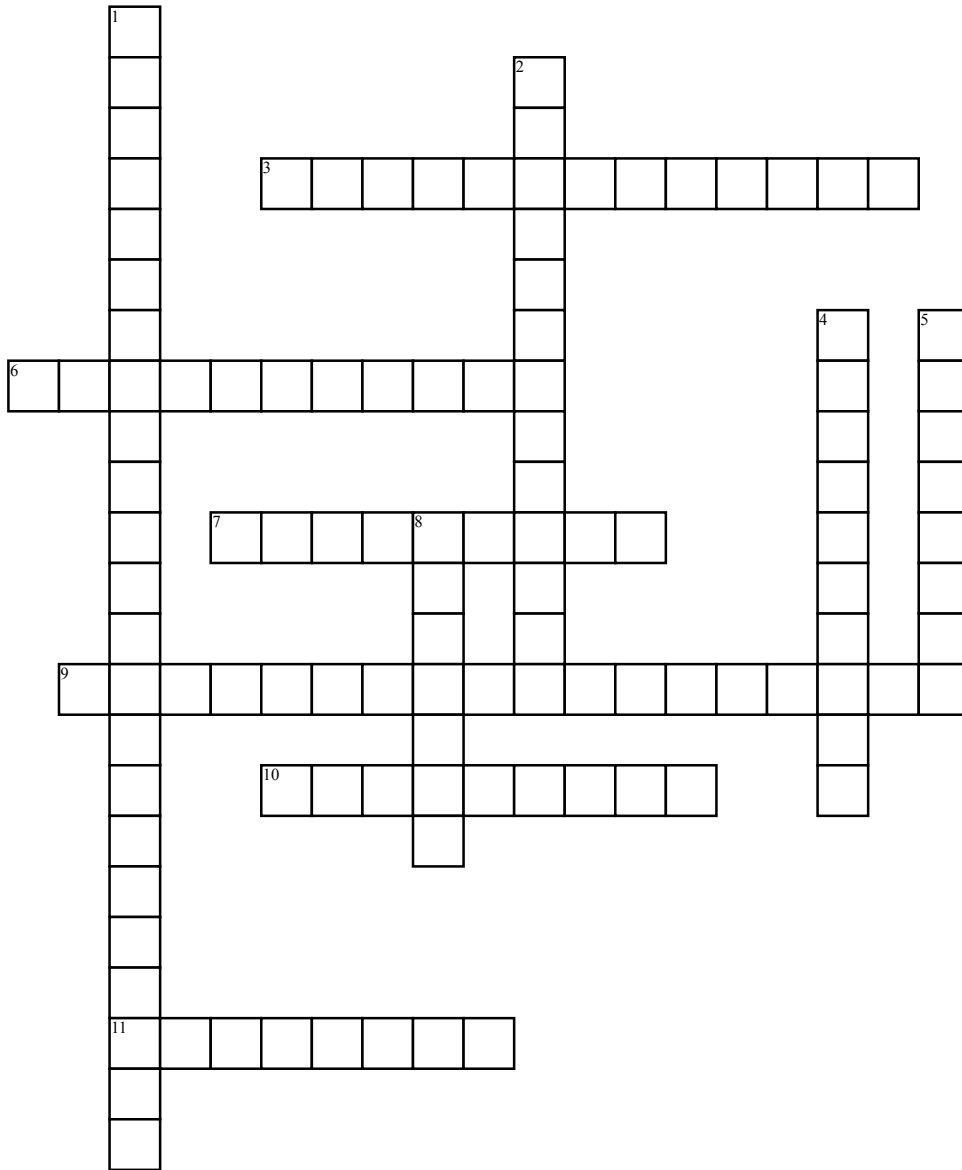

- 6. arguments that have conclusions that do not follow the premises
- 7. appeal to popularity
- 9. arguments assume that a point of view is true because the truth of premise is assumed
- 10. arguments that attempt to discredit a point of view through personal attacks
- 11. arguments force either/or choices when there are more options

Down

- 1. two events are correlated implies that one causes the other
- 2. one event will inevitably lead to another event
- 4. arguments that avoid the issue and distract
- 5. position of opponent is exaggerated or weakened
- 8. one event caused the other because one occurred before the other
