2. was United States Secretary of State from 1861 to 1869, and earlier served as Governor of New York and United States Senator

4. a Commodore of the United States Navy and commanded a number of ships. He served in several wars, most notably in the Mexican-American War and the War of 1812.

6. a policy of remaining apart from the affairs or interests of other groups, especially the political affairs of other countries.

7. a country or area in which another country has power to affect developments although it has no formal authority.

8. a sum of money granted by the government or a public body to assist an industry or business so that the price of a commodity or service may remain low or competitive.

9. statement of principles initiated by the United States in 1899 and 1900 for the protection of equal privileges among countries trading with China and in support of Chinese territorial and administrative integrity.

10. an act of the United States Congress framed by Representative William McKinley that became law on October 1, 1890.
