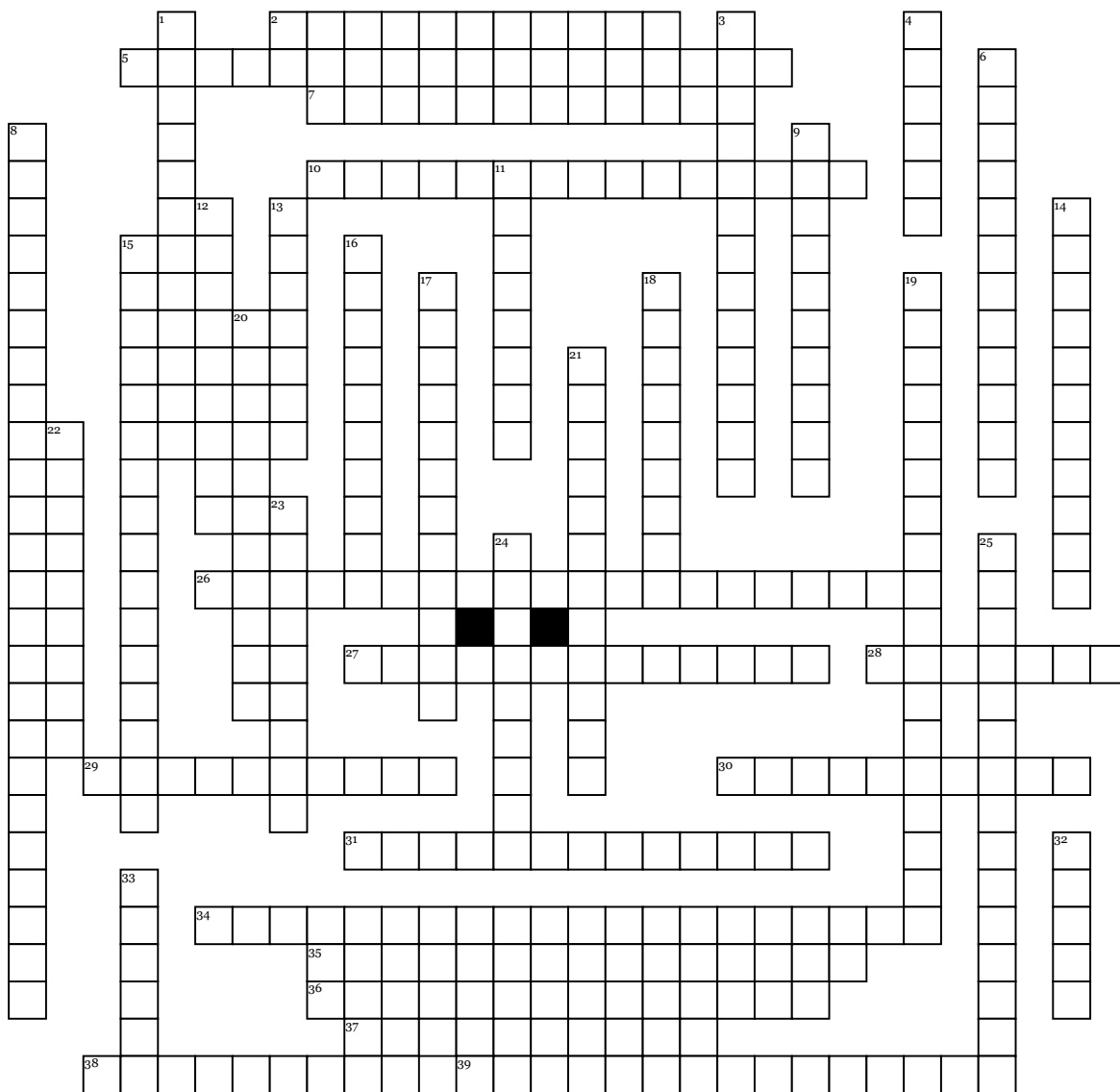


STATE PARKS AND ACTIVITIES

- 2.** The park's main feature is a half-mile long set of waterfalls
- 5.** An 11-mile (18 km) long heritage railroad that is owned by the state of West Virginia
- 7.** State park in Raleigh County, West Virginia. It is located near Beckley, West Virginia,
- 10.** Most of this trail is surrounded by peaks of the Allegheny Mountains
- 26.** Some of the attractions include Horsedrawn carriage rides, Souvenir shop and Hiking
- 27.** 2,320 feet (710 m) above sea level, is the highest point in the park and in Morgan County.[3]
- 28.** Located along the New River Gorge
- 29.** The second largest park in the West Virginia state park system with a total of 8,294 acres
- 30.** Sits on 391 acres near Grafton, West Virginia
- 31.** This park features a reconstructed refuge fort and commemorates life on the Virginia frontier during the late 18th century.[
- 34.** A pioneer homestead and museum located in Harrison County, West Virginia
- 35.** Two namesake waterfalls are accessed by a hiking trail and are located about 1/2-mile apart
- 36.** The Park name derives from a narrowleaf meadowsweet common shrub historically used for making pipe stems

- 37.** Wyandot Indian phrase meaning "the point between two waters" in English

- 38.** Largest virgin timber tract remaining in West Virginia. The park features trees of up to 90 feet in height and 16 feet in circumference

- 39.** The centerpiece of this Park is its historic mineral spa.

Down

- 1.** Resort opened for skiing in 1971, on the original site of Weiss Knob Ski Area.
- 3.** Located on the rim of the Gauley River Canyon near Summersville, a town in Nicholas County
- 4.** Going for a long, vigorous walk,
- 6.** This monument, at the headspring of the Potomac River, Marks one of the historic spots of America
- 8.** Site of the last major conflict of the American Civil War in West Virginia.
- 9.** This State Park includes a log cabin now used as the campground check-in station, and the Pine Run One Room Schoolhouse
- 11.** Located on the eastern summit of Droop Mountain
- 12.** The park is located near the site of a 1756 skirmish during the French and Indian War.
- 13.** Outdoor recreational activity involving overnight stays away from home in a shelter such as a tent, a caravan, or even a motorhome.

- 14.** Outdoor recreation of carrying gear on one's back, while hiking for more than a day.

- 15.** The resort is located in Lewis County, West Virginia, about 10 miles (16 km) south of Weston

- 16.** Named after Native American leader who lived in the region before the American Revolutionary War.

- 17.** A 374-acre (151 ha)[1] day use facility in Mercer County, West Virginia.

- 18.** The park's lodge and aerial gondola to the river are along U.S. 60.

- 19.** Part of the American Discovery Trail.

- 20.** Underneath the flyway of the fall eastern hawk migration.

- 21.** The only state park in West Virginia that offers overnight accommodations in a yurt

- 22.** Famous outdoor musical dramas such as "Hatfields and McCoys," are performed at Grandview Park, near Beckley, West Virginia

- 23.** Located in both Cabell County and Wayne County

- 24.** Nearest city to this State Park is Princeton

- 25.** Located about two miles southeast of the town of Davis

- 32.** The site of Alum Cave, which is accessible by a boardwalk built along this overhanging sandstone ledge.

- 33.** The largest of West Virginia's state parks
