

2. at time of discharge, a complete list of these are generated for the patient's information or that of the next health care provider

4. built-in alarms to alert users about malfunctions, misconnections, patient status and more

- 7. one of the most common HAIs
- 10. a tool to aid the caregiver in gathering necessary information that needs to be relayed to another provider
- 13. decreases the spread of germs
- 14. use this to assess the patient's skin on admission, every shift, upon change in patient condition, upon transfer to another unit, or transfer to another facility for skin impairments
- 16. are never to be turned off, but may be silenced for a brief period while the issue is addressed

- 20. the means by which the patient's medications and how taken at home are verified and made available for the care provider to continue, modify, or discontinue while the patient is in the hospital
- 22. this red-orange label is placed on malfunctioning equipment
