

- **12.** A thick and creamy mix of clay and water used for joining clay parts together or for decorating the surface. Applied before firing, when the clay is still wet.

- **17.** A piece of clay that is a flat even piece of clay
- **19.** Second firing of the clay with a coating of glaze upon its surface.
