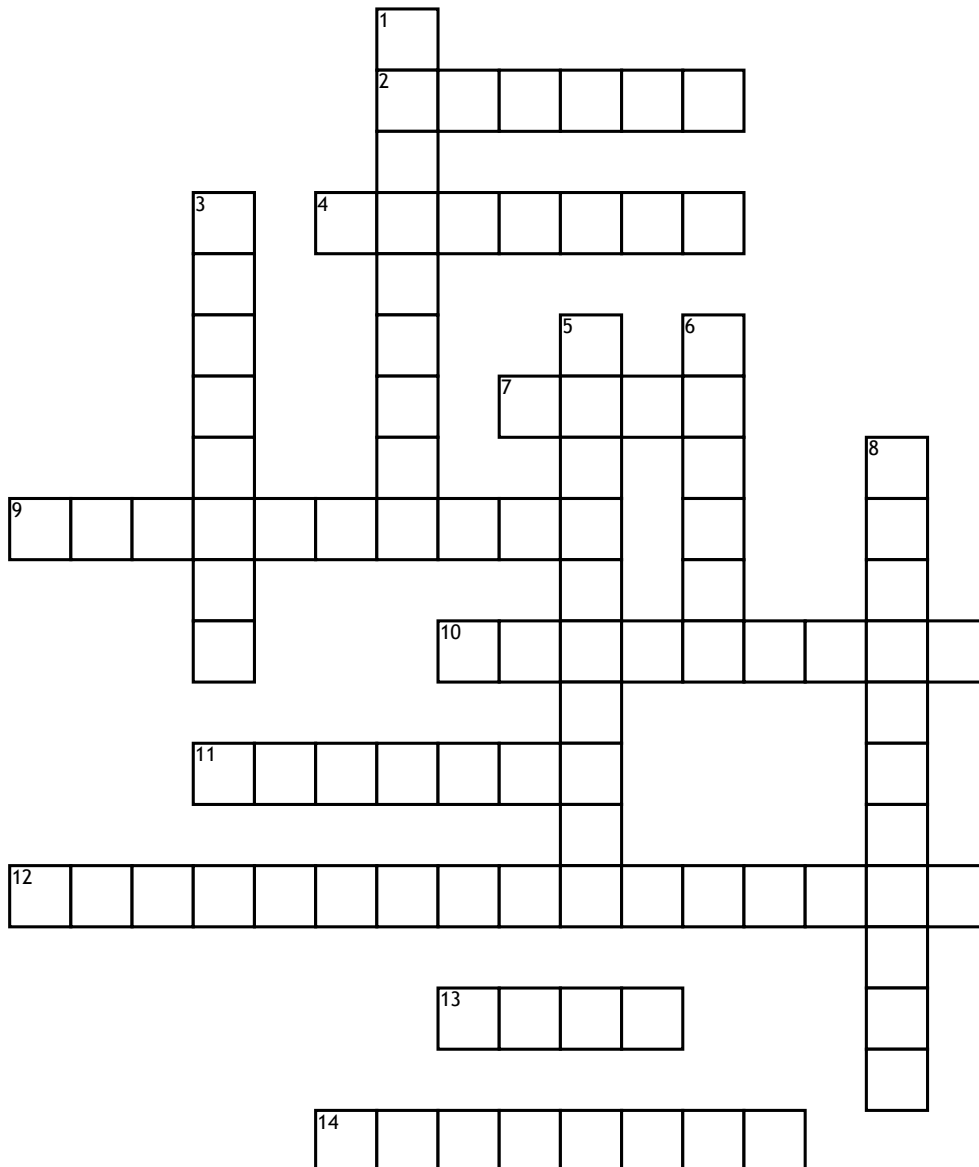


Second Six Week Vocabulary Crossword
