
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Sensory Terminology

- 1. the process by which green plants and some other organisms use sunlight to synthesize foods from carbon dioxide and water. Photosynthesis in plants generally involves the green pigment chlorophyll and generates oxygen as a byproduct.
- **3.** surgical incision into the eardrum, to relieve pressure or drain fluid.
- 11. each of the two threadlike strands into which a chromosome divides longitudinally during cell division. Each contains a double helix of DNA.
- **12.** an abnormal growth of bone near the middle ear. It can result in hearing loss.
- **14.** (of an edition or copy) exactly reproducing an original version.

- **15.** the spiral cavity of the inner ear containing the organ of Corti, which produces nerve impulses in response to sound vibrations.
- **16.** a test of the action of the heart using ultrasound waves to produce a visual display, used for the diagnosis or monitoring of heart disease.
- **17.** a person who is knowledgeable about the nature and appreciation of beauty, especially in art.
