

5. a test of the action of the heart using ultrasound waves to produce a visual display, used for the diagnosis or monitoring of heart disease.

7. the process by which green plants and some other organisms use sunlight to synthesize foods from carbon dioxide and water. Photosynthesis in plants generally involves the green pigment chlorophyll and generates oxygen as a byproduct.

10. the flow of tears.

12. farsightedness caused by loss of elasticity of the lens of the eye, occurring typically in middle and old age.

13. a graphic record produced by audiometry.

15. impaired or dim vision without obvious defect or change in the eye.

16. surgical incision into the eardrum, to relieve pressure or drain fluid.
