

- **3.** Fundamental functional unit of much compact bone, also known as the Haversion System
- **6.** Made up of spongy bone, filled with bone marrow facing away from the body
- **10.** Hollow inside with an open space called the medullary cavity filled with yellow bone marrow
- **11.** Serves as protection as well as a channel for the blood supply and nutrients for bone tissue
- **12.** White tissue that covers the ends of bones that come together to form joints
- **14.** Generate blood cells, most abundant in adolescents

- 15. Known as the marrow cavity
- 17. Mature bone cells
- **19.** Small channels in the bone that transmit blood vessels and communicate with the Haversian canals
- 20. Produces bone cells

<u>Down</u>

- 1. Absorb and remodel bone cells
- 2. Houses the osteocytes
- **4.** Rounded end of a long bone filled with long red bone facing toward the body
- **5.** Area of growth in a long bone. It is a layer of hyaline cartilage where ossification occurs in immature bones

- 7. Contains the lacunae that contain the osteocytes, made up of dense bone matrix
- **8.** Compact bone tissue that surrounds a central canal
- **9.** Fatty network of connective tissue that fills the cavities of bones, in adults YELLOW
- **13.** Determines the future length and shape of the mature bone, also known as the growth plate
- **16.** Houses blood vessels and nerves within the bone
- **18.** Known as trabecular bone located at the end of long bones
