

- 1. The scientific study of how a person's thoughts, feelings, and behavior influence and are influenced by social groups
- 2. Referring to the effect that the presence of other people has on the decision to help or not help, with help becoming less likely as the number of bystanders increases
- **3.** The tendency to overestimate the influence of internal factors in determining behavior while underestimating situational factors

- **4.** Cause of behavior attributed to external factors, such as delays, the action of others, or some other aspect of the situation
- **5.** Socially desirable behavior that benefits others
- **6.** Sense of discomfort or distress that occurs when a person's behavior does not correspond to that person's attitudes
- 7. Educational technique in which each individual is given only part of the information needed to solve a problem, causing the separate individuals to be forced to work together to find the solution
