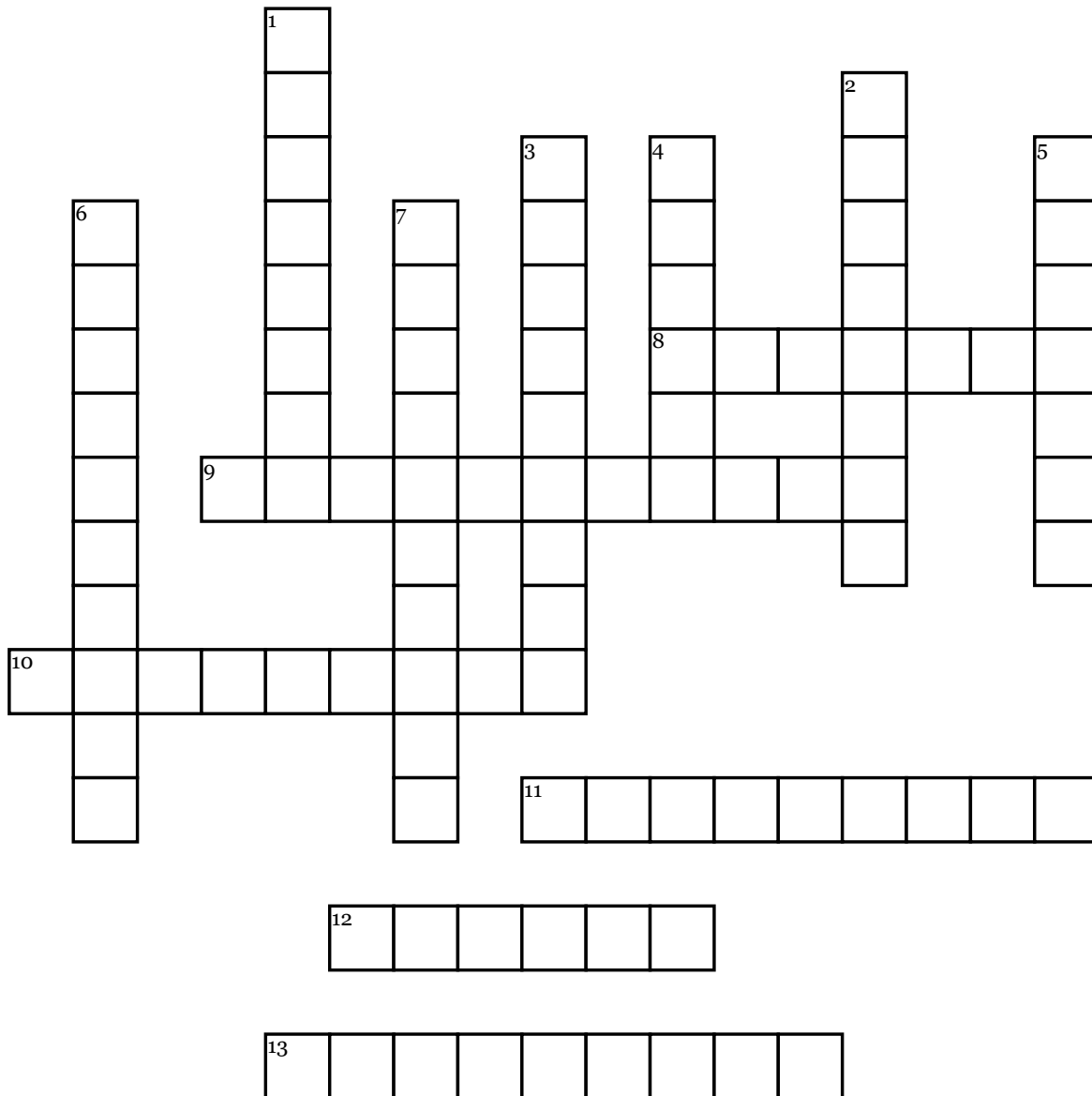

1. a member of a small independent group taking part in irregular fighting, typically against larger regular forces.

2. any of various radical or socialist groups, in particular a militant youth movement in China (1966–76) that carried out attacks on intellectuals and other disfavored groups as part of Mao Zedong's Cultural Revolution.

3. a biological community of interacting organisms and their physical environment.

4. political and spiritual leader during India's struggle with Great Britain for home rule; an advocate of passive resistance (1869-1948)

5. a country in SE Asia, comprising the former states of Annam, Tonkin, and Cochinchina: formerly part of French Indochina; divided into North Vietnam and South Vietnam during the Vietnam War but now reunified. 126,104 sq

6. a bomb that derives its destructive power from the rapid release of nuclear energy by fission of heavy atomic nuclei, causing damage through heat, blast, and radioactivity.
