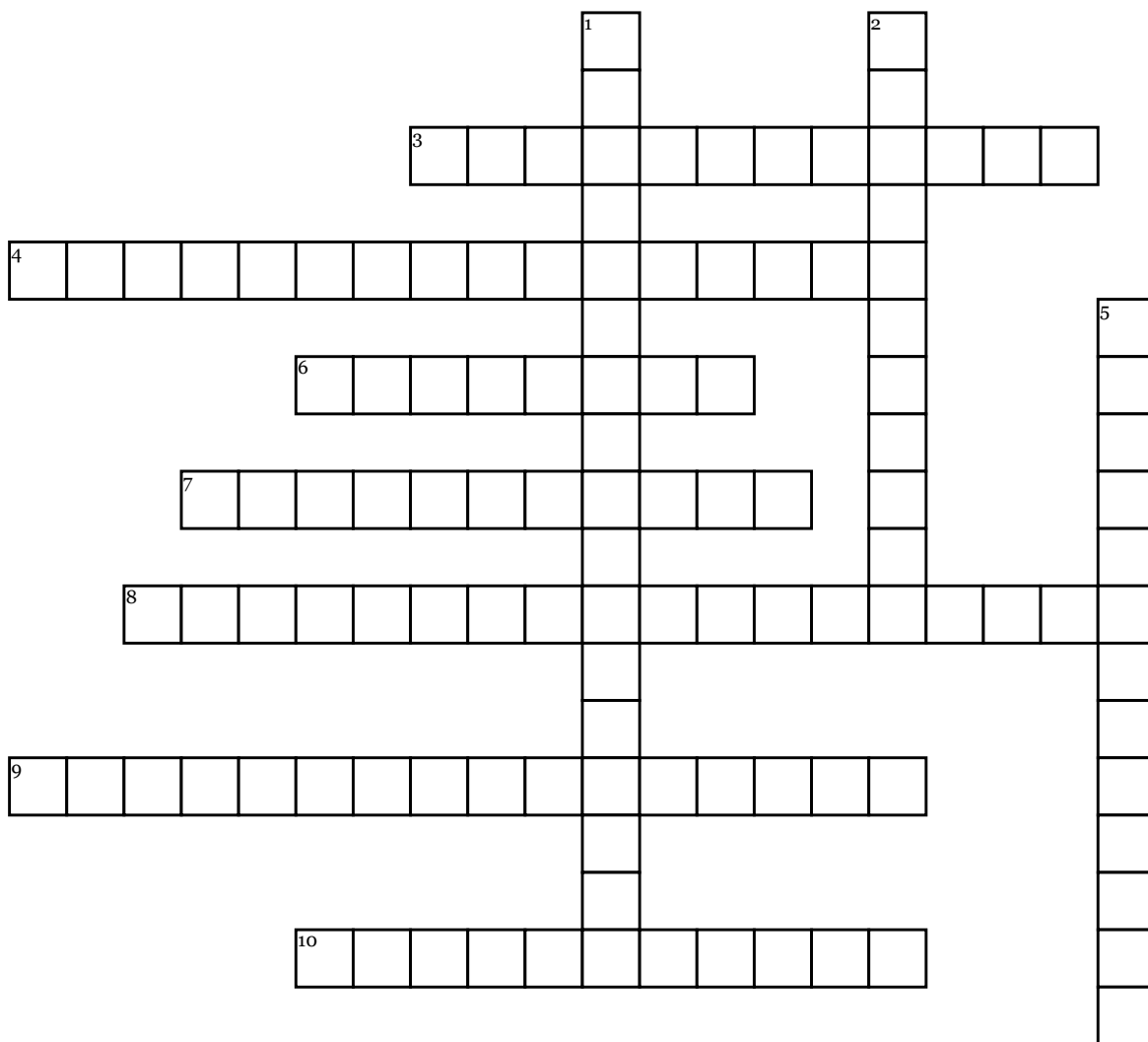

1. The nickname for the Spanish American War because it was short, inexpensive but the gains for the U.S. were huge; the United States gained new territories and was viewed as a World Power

5. The treaty that ended the Spanish American War; it gave Cuba its independence from Spain, the United States was given Puerto Rico and Guam and the U.S. was sold the Philippines for \$20 million
