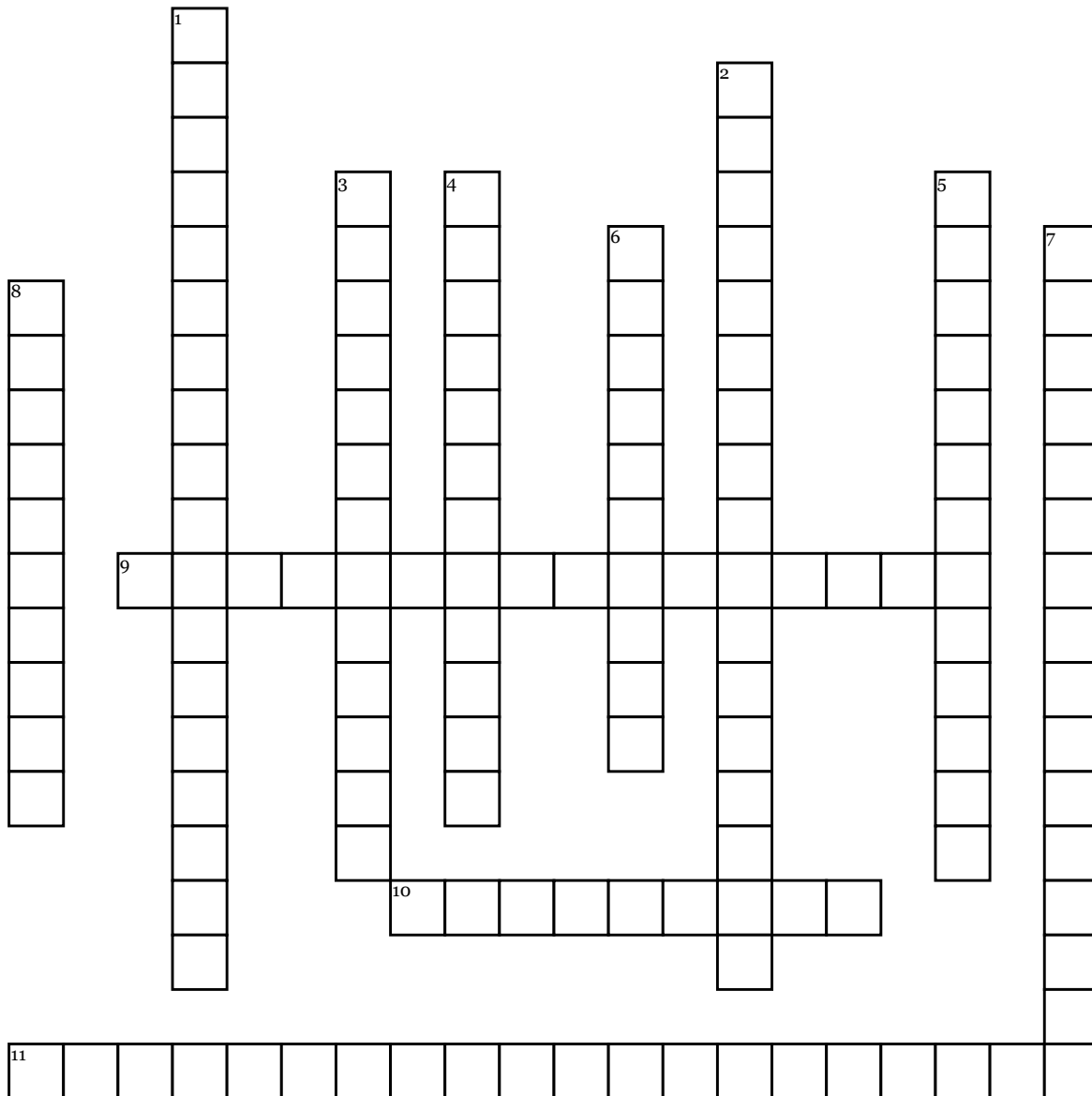


Standard 7 Crossword

10. American sociologist, important black protest leader in the United States during the first half of the 20th century.

11. First woman to serve in the U.S. Senate, she was a writer and a campaigner for Women Rights

1. Georgia's three most powerful and prominent politicians of the Reconstruction era that practically held a lock on the state's U.S. Senate seats and governor's office from 1872 to 1890

2. First president and principal developer of Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute (now Tuskegee University)

3. First African American president of Morehouse College and president of Atlanta University (later Clark Atlanta University)

4. Elected for the Ga General Assembly in 1882, the US H.O.R in 1890 and Senate in 1920. He was also nominated by the Populist Party as its vice presidential candidate in 1896

5. Founder and president of the Atlanta Life Insurance Company

6. Served as managing editor for the Atlanta Constitution in the 1880s and also a member of the Atlanta Ring of Democratic political leaders

7. The first major hearing into the meaning of the 14th Amendment's equal protection provision

8. Founded in 1886, this organization wants the reestablishment of white supremacy—fulfilled through Democratic victories in state legislatures across the South
