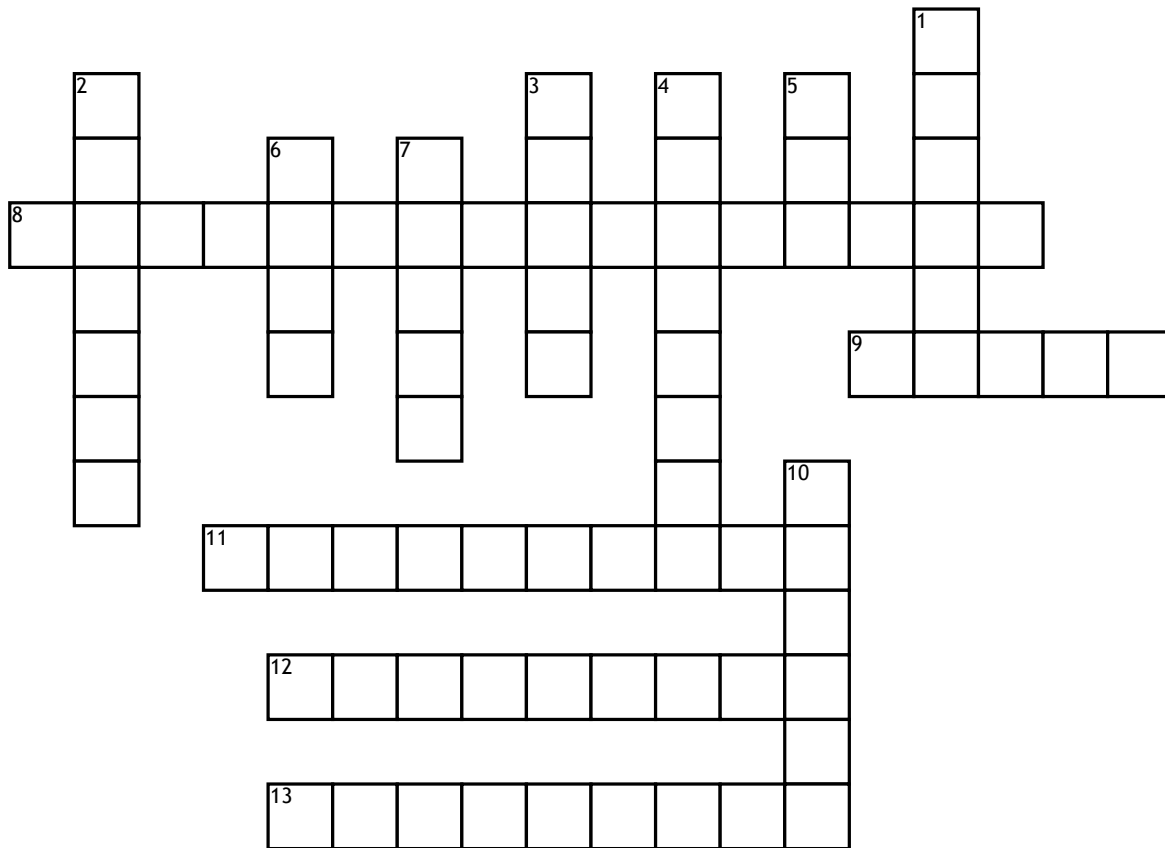

- 1.** a person or group of people who act as a narrator, commentator, or general audience to the action of the play
2. a serious work of drama in which the hero suffers catastrophe or serious misfortune, usually because of his own actions
3. a work of literature designed to be performed in front of an audience
4. conversation between two or more characters

- 5.** a division within a play, much like chapters of a novel
6. a character who is nearly opposite of another character: the purpose of foil is to reveal a stark contrast between the two characters, often the protagonist and antagonist
7. a division of an act into smaller parts
