

- **3.** AKA declaration of rights. Modeled after the declaration of Independence, asking for Women's, educational rights, Property Rights and suffrage
- **6.** She organized the Seneca Falls convention and part of the National Woman's suffrage Association along with Susan B. Anthony
- **8.** School teacher, abolitionist, Part of National Women's Suffrage Association
- **9.** Amendment that allowed women to vote. Came into the constitution in August 1920 (72 years after the Seneca Falls Convention in 1828)

- 1. Supporter of Feminists (female/Women)
- 2. Explained the roles of men and women, about women working outside their homes, being against the law...Women were unable to have their own careers
- **4.** A convention discussing the social, civil, and religious conditions of women rights (July 19th-20th, 1848)
- **5.** Amendment that recognized citizens born or naturalized in the United States, but didn't specifically announce voting rights

- 7. President of the Unites states, during WWI. Elected 1912.
- **10.** Organization formed by Alice Paul and Lucy Burns (abbreviation of word)
- **11.** An organization who fought for women suffrage and was later turned into the NWP (National Womens Party) by its founders Alice Paul and Lucy Burns
- **12.** She helped formed National Womens Party
- **13.** A period of time when the United States were social activists, and to purify the government
