


# Terms to Know

- 1. A practice or trial performance of a play or other work for later public performance
- 3. Conversation between two or more people
- 5. An unframed curtain that is lowered to a stage from the flies, often serving as background scenery
- 8. A program usually containing information about the play, cast, crew, supporters, and advertisers
- 12. A theatrical show made up of songs, dances, and skits
- 13. The placement, intensity, and color of lights to help communicate environment, mood, or feeling

- 15. Overshadowing another actor

- 16. The left side of the stage from the perspective of an actor facing the audience
- 17. The planning and working out of the movements of actors on stage
- 18. Slope of stage (to allow actors to be seen)
- 19. The stock of costumes and accessories which are owned by a theater group
- 20. The encouragement behind a literary work (the motivation for the author)

- 2. The area of the stage closest to the audience

- 4. A high-intensity work fixture which is used to illuminate the stage for the benefit of technicians
- 6. An object used in a stage play to further the action
- 7. To mark the stage floor, usually with colored tape, where set pieces will rest
- 9. The final night of the last performance where everyone will tear down the set and return rented materials
- 10. The offstage areas directly left and right of the performance stage
- 11. The stage area away from the audience
