

- **9.** What is the central portion of the osseous labyrinth?
- **10.** Footplate of the stapes is embedded here.
- **12.** Houses the organs for hearing
- **14.** Marks entrance to the Scala Tympani of the cochlea
- **18.** Largest of the ossicles that provides the point of attachment of the tympanic membrane
