

- 3. Establishes the Constitution as the supreme law of the USA. Authorizes the national debt (Congress can borrow money). All public officials must take an oath to support the Constitution
- **5.** Freedom of religion, press, speech, right to assembly, and right to petition the government
- **8.** Lists the requirements for ratification (formal approval) of the Constitution
- **12.** Right to a speedy trial by jury and confrontation of witnesses
- **14.** Establishes the Judicial Branch (a system of courts and judges). Supreme Court
- **15.** Limits Search and seizure of property by the government

- **16.** People may have other rights, even if they are not listed in The Constitution
- 17. Establishes the relationship between the states and the federal government. Describes how to admit new states to the Union
- **18.** Prohibits cruel and unusual punishment

- 1. Explains that the Constitution proposes to establish a more perfect government complete with justice, tranquility, and liberty
- **2.** Describes how to amend the Constitution. Makes it strong but flexible
- 4. Limits the quartering of soldiers
- **6.** Right to a trial by jury in civil cases. This no longer applies except in high-value cases

- 7. The federal government's powers are limited to those listed in the Constitution
- **9.** Establishes the Legislative Branch-Congress (House of Representatives and the Senate)
- **10.** Establishes the Executive Branch headed by the President with vice president and cabinet
- 11. Right to a trial if accused, no self-incrimination, no double-jeopardy, right to compensation for takings by gov't, spouse cannot testify against you
- 13. Right to bear arms and a well-regulated militia
