**14.** Any of a group of colors from which all other colors can be obtained by mixing.

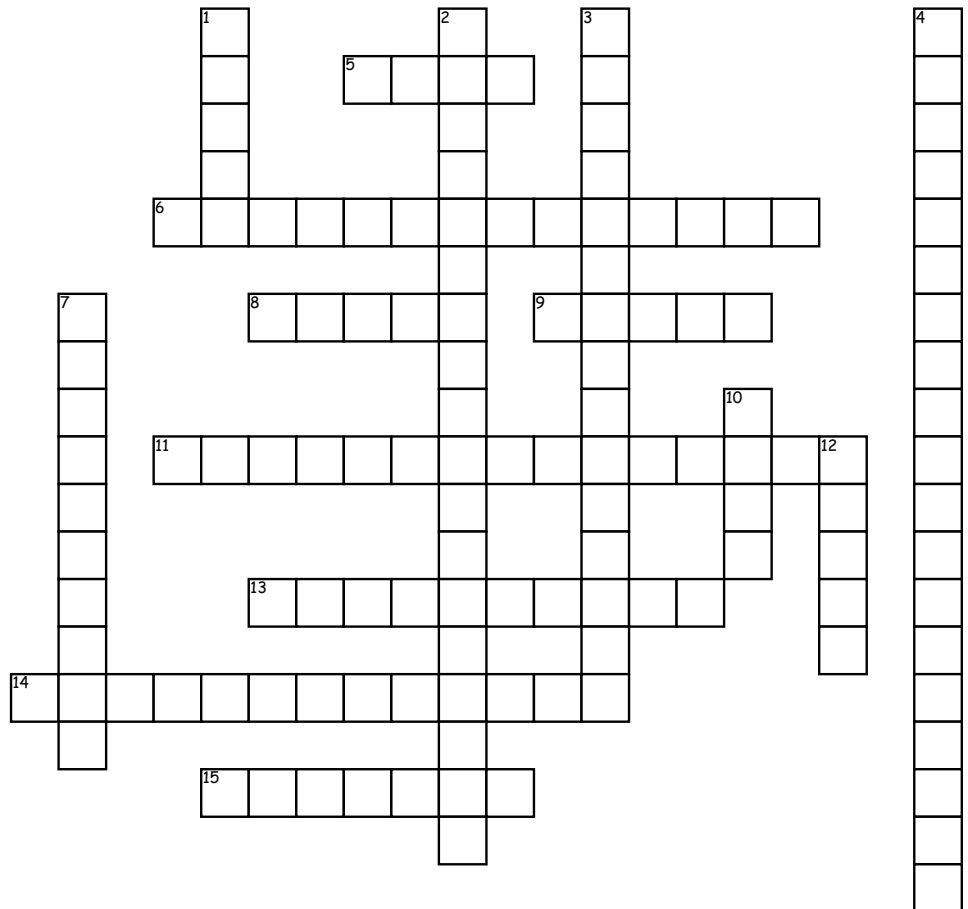
**15.** An element of art that refers to the way things feel, or look as if they might feel if touched.

**10.** An element of art that is three-dimensional and encloses volume; includes height, width AND depth.
